





West Michigan's Big Crunch USA Recaptures World Record with 19,087 Apple Crunchers!



For the third consecutive year, North Muskegon Public Schools (NMPS) participated in the "Apple Crunch" event on October 24, 2013 at 2:12pm. This means NMPS students and staff from 15 other school districts across West Michigan, along with community members from nearly 50 businesses and organizations, bit into an apple at the same time adding to a total of 19,087 bites at once! All 12 school districts in Muskegon County participated, along with schools from Shelby, South Haven and Otsego.

Michell Leigois, Food Services Supervisor at NMPS, said she looks forward to the event. "It is a great way to make healthy eating fun and to remind our community about our local agriculture and access to fresh, local produce," she said.

North Muskegon purchased the apples from Aebig farms in New Era, which included a variety of Gala and Delicious apples. Just to be sure that all students could participate, the district purchased sliced apples for the students with braces.

In June we had a few staff members retire. We want to thank them all for their service and dedication.



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

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Norseman Cool Jazz 5

The next time you are in the Flex Learning Center Lobby, look up! Your eyes will be treated to a wonderfully-delightful hanging sculpture by artist Faisal Martin Meerzo. A 1951 graduate of North Muskegon, Mr. Meerzo, created the artwork titled "Norsemen Cool Jazz 5" specifically for the school and donated it on behalf of his graduating class.

Mr. Meerzo was born in Grand Haven Michigan in 1932. He has always had an interest in creating new and different things and has built a wide range of items over the past 60+ years, including race cars, kites, bikes, lanterns and sculptures.

His interest in creating things began at the age of 12 when he built a gas-powered go cart; he built his first motorbike at 15. At 18 he was building V8 pickup powered Hot Rods and a few years later he was doing various engine conversions. At 24 he built a Chrysler Hemi powered 54 Corvette. In 1957 he formed the Saginaw Valley Sports Car Club and in 1967 helped it change to Region 100 SCCA. By 1960 he was designing, building, and racing his own sports cars. In 1962 after 10 years of racing, he started building welded art and Mutzo Motor Bikes.

He said that he was not a talented musician, but that he has "great memories of bands of the past: Dixieland and the Pep bands." He shared that his older brother was a talented musician, "Apparently, the musical genes did not flow down as my older brother Al had a dance band at NMHS five years before I was in high school."

His self-proclaimed lack of talent did not stop him from taking part in the band. "I was a band member-not good enough to play-but I filled in during marching formations,"

he said, "and I raised of the flag with my good friend, Jerry Upman."

His inspiration for the sculpture was the result of the music from his past. "When I constructed the art piece I thought of the pep bands and the hot and cool jazz groups that I heard in my school years. The horns look like they could have played at the summer dances, the horns and their patina mimic the Class of 1951 and their life experiences"

He now divides his time between Indiana and Florida. The North Muskegon Music Boosters has donated a plaque to hang in the lobby to honor the work and the artist and wish to thank Mr. Meerzo for his creation.



Coach Brenneman Honored as Assistant Coach of the Year

Dr. Wayne Brenneman, or "Coach B" as the girls call him, will be honored as the Michigan High School Tennis Coaches Association's Assistant Coach of the Year on February 7th at the annual Hall of Fame Banquet in Troy, MI.

Anthony Uriarte and Josh Greiner, Seniors at North Muskegon and members of the Muskegon Area Robotics Society, collaborated with Customized Mobility to create a one-of-a-kind wheelchair for a child who loves Dr. Seuss. The students rose to the challenge and came up with three lighting systems: wheel lights to light the custom wheel cover plates, under-glow lighting, made from color changing LED lights to provide a glow under the wheelchair, and head lights for when the child needs to see or be seen in a dark environment. All lights were powered from an on-board rechargeable battery pack that also had USB plugs for hand-held devices such as iPod, games etc.

The student was thrilled with the chair and the M.A.R.S students were excited to be able stretch their imaginations and skills by working on this project. NM Graduate Wins the America's Cup

From the relatively calm waters of Muskegon Lake to the wide-open sea, Pete Balash has made his mark in the sailing world. Last September Balash, a 1991 North Muskegon graduate, was on the winning team of the 2013 America's Cup Finals in San Francisco, California. The American defender rallied from being down 8-1, to win eight consecutive matches over a very tough Emirates Team New Zealand.

Balash, along with fellow classmate and Oracle Team USA teammate, John Holstrom, started his love of sailing at the Muskegon Yacht Club when he was a junior at North Muskegon. His passion for sailing led him to become a boat builder, which is how he became connected with the Oracle team back in 2001. He also

sailed the boat before managing the on-water safety for the team.

In a 2012 interview, Balash talked about his job. "The first thing is everyone's safety," Balash said. "The first priority is getting everyone out of the water." He and his team did just that on October 6, 2012 when the Oracle capsized during the Fleet Race 5 in the America's Cup World Series in San Francisco. After securing everyone's personal safety, the rescue team quickly righted the boat and the team ultimately sailed to the win.

Skipper James Spithall was quick to praise Balash and his crew, "Just a fantastic job by Pete and the boys in the chase boat; they got us up and ready for the next race." Of the quick recovery, Spithall said, "I'm very impressed with the team."

The Oracle is a catamaran: a scrim of netting stretched between two, 72-foot-long hulls, which are connected to each other by crossbeams. Instead of a sail, the racing yacht has a 13-story rigid wing that acts as the boat's engine.

During a practice run later in October 2012, the team capsized again. This time Balash and his teammates spent hours trying to retrieve the \$10 million

vessel as it was swept 10 miles out to sea under the Golden Gate Bridge. The main hull and pieces were collected and the ship was rebuilt in time to race in the 34th Annual America's Cup this year.

Balash acknowledged that racing boats of this size and speed is dangerous. In May 2013, Balash lost a good friend, Olympian Andrew "Bart" Simpson, who died when the boat he was on, the Artemis, broke apart and capsized. Rescue teams from other teams helped in the rescue attempts, including Balash's.

"It was one of the hardest things I've ever had to witness," he said.

As a result of the accident, Balash was part of a small committee working with the US Coast Guard that developed new safety crisis plans and formulated on-water rules for the large ships.

His advice to students: "Get out and travel the world. Never say no to any opportunity. Don't be afraid to leave home." Balash continues his travels around the world and has recently moved to Florida where he will be captain for Team Hooligan, a sailing team based out of Newport, Rhode Island.

Madame Bernadette Billock received 2013 World Language Educator of the Year Award and was honored at the Michigan World Language Association Conference luncheon held on November 8, 2013 in Lansing. Billock is a foreign language teacher at North Muskegon Public Schools, teaching her native French, as well as Spanish, to middle and high school students. "I go to school every day joyfully and prepared to face new challenges. My main focus is to instill in my students the desire for knowledge acquisition, not just getting good grades. My motto is 'Don't study for the grade but for knowledge,'" Billock said.

This is not the first honor bestowed on Madame Billock this year. Earlier in 2013, the Michigan Education Association selected her to receive an EPICS award, which stands for exceptional people in community schools.

Superintendent, Dr. Curt Babcock, shared his high praise of Billock. "We are extremely fortunate to have a teacher like Madame Billock," Babcock said. "She is an asset to North Muskegon and the students she serves. We are very proud of her getting this much-deserved recognition!"

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
