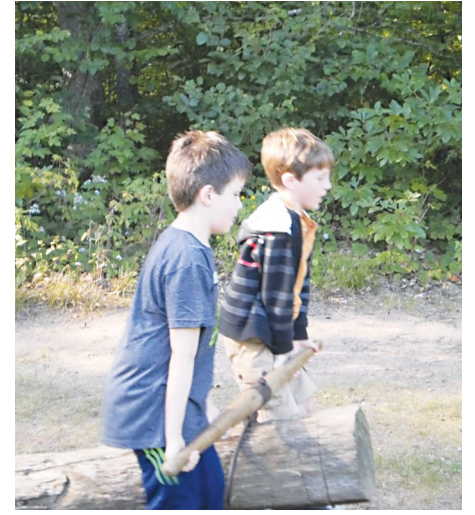

Norse Nature Preserve Outdoor Classroom

Spring is here and everyone is anxious to get outside for fresh air and sunshine. Wouldn't it be great for students to experience nature as

part of their regular learning environment throughout the school year? Last November, ten middle school students attended the Michigan Middle School Leadership Initiative (MMLI) at Camp Miniwanca and returned with that goal in mind. The civic project for MMLI 2013-14 is to build an outdoor classroom. The plan is moving forward and will happen in the Norse Nature Preserve between the playground and Bear Lake. According to Canada's TD Friends of the Environment Foundation,

"Outdoor classroom designs incorporate seating, teaching platforms and natural elements to explore. A well-planned outdoor classroom that is integrated into the school community will become an important part of your school and can be used for every subject, in every season. There is no standard design for an outdoor classroom; the key is to develop the classroom that will work best for your school grounds and the needs of your school."

Students have been engaged with the Norse Nature Preserve for years. Former Superintendent John

Weaver led elementary students on annual nature walks; Boy Scout Trevor Wilson, class of 2006, labeled trails and trees in 2002 to earn his Eagle Scout; Erin Zettell, class of 2012, directed heavy machinery (a skidder) to clear underbrush for trails; Taylor Bluhm, class of 2012, tagged dead trees that were cut into usable stumps; and Honor Society students removed invasive garlic mustard, cleaned the stairs, and picked up trash in the spring of 2012.

The High School Environmental Club, advised by Ms. Debra Johnson and led by senior Matt Hanley, have plans to construct an observation deck or floating dock along the shoreline of Bear Lake before school starts next fall, and the outdoor classroom group learning area will be added to the Norse Nature Preserve this spring. The group meeting area will have standing tables, tables with stump chairs, and a chalkboard. Next fall,

teachers in every subject area will be able to use the group learning area and observation deck in the Norse Nature Preserve for instruction and learning activities.

The MMLI students have been meeting once a week during lunch to make the vision for The Rick Howard Outdoor Classroom a reality. They want to honor retired science teacher Mr. Rick Howard because he always wanted an outdoor classroom. Former students from MMLI have joined the cause and are now working with the High School Environmental Club. The development is moving forward because of MMLI advisory help from Mrs. Ellen Berends, architectural planning by Mr. Harry Wierenga, guidance from



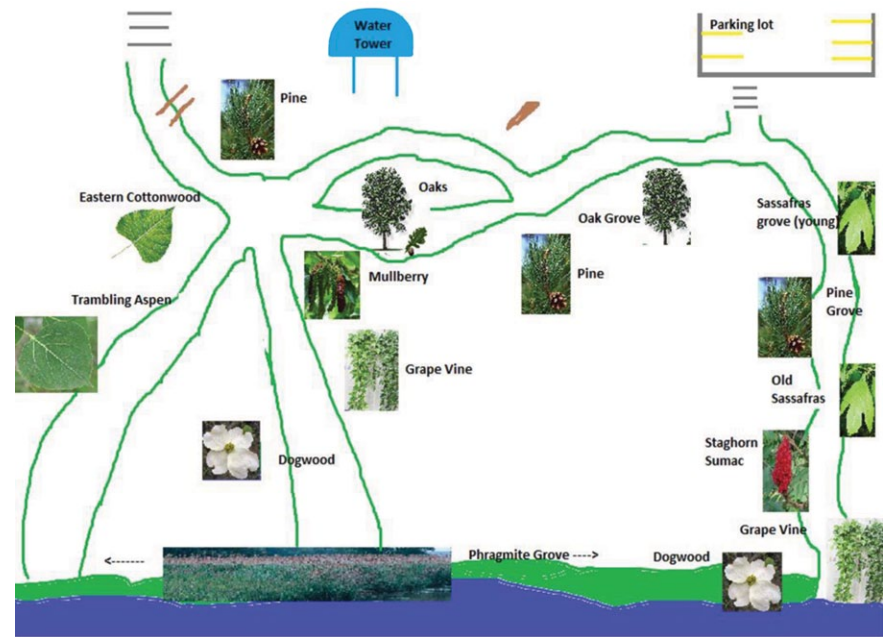
Ms. Debra Johnson, and support from Mr. Rick Howard, Mrs. Mary Bakale, student volunteers, and school administrators. The development and maintenance of the Norse Nature Preserve will take community effort and money.

Fundraising efforts will continue. The MMLI Family Fun Fair on

March 22, 2014 raised nearly \$1,000 and money is available through the Norse Outdoor Classroom Fund established by the Bakales and the Norse Education Foundation. The Bakale fund purchased 30 folding stools and 15 backpacks with nature-exploring supplies for the Elementary in 2012. Any donations should be made payable to NMPS and tagged for the Outdoor Classroom.

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Art in the Moment Challenge

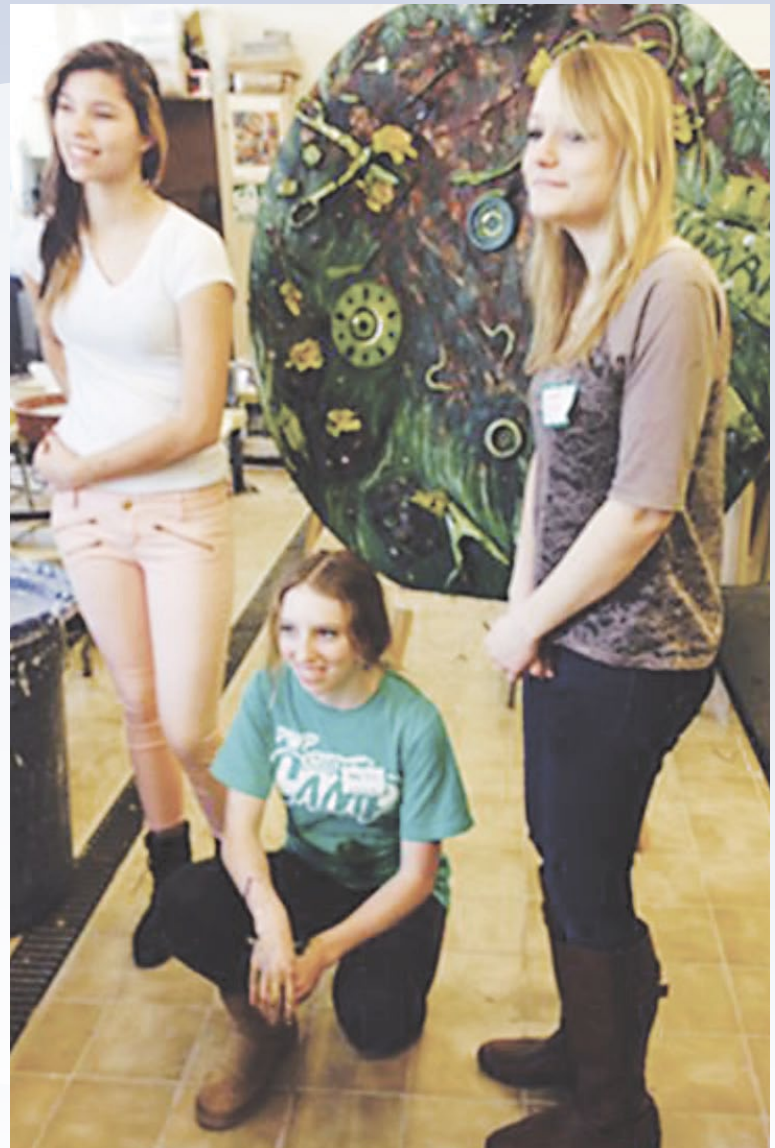

Writing Research Project

NMHS English Teacher Michael Schanhals is participating in the Statewide Writing Research Project which is run by the Oakland Area Intermediate School District and the Writing in Digital Environments department at Michigan State University, and includes 18 veteran English teachers from around the state. The participants are all holders of National Writing Project fellowships.

The project integrates on-site formative work and innovations in technology to look at interactive feedback and peer-review as a means of leveraging critical reading and writing skills. Mr. Schanhals' American Literature classroom has been a model classroom for the researchers and participants in the project, and data has been collected and to be analyzed by the researchers at Michigan State University. The results of the research will help drive curricular improvements nationwide in writing pedagogy and formative feedback loops.

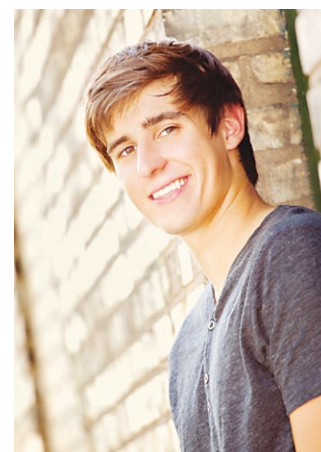

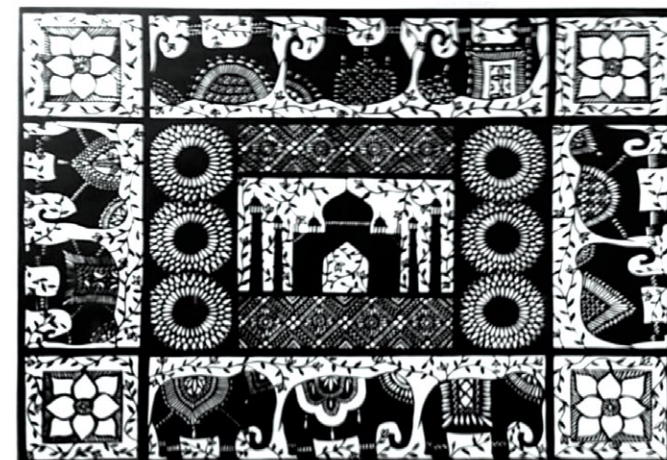
