THANK YOU MONA SHORES COMMUNITY!

On November 4th, our school community voted to renew our non-homestead and sinking fund to help take care of our school facilities. Thank you for supporting our school district. Renewing our sinking fund is the 1st of 3 phases to ensure we have facilities to support teaching and learning. The following timeline will provide an overview of our phases:

Fall of 2013 - The Board of Education hired TowerPinkster (Architects) to conduct a facilities assessment

Spring of 2014 - The Board of Education hired Triangle (Construction) to analyze the cost of the recommendations TowerPinkster presented to the Board of Education



August of 2014 - A community group (Facilities Advisory Committee) of stakeholders met to discuss the recommendations and cost allocations

October of 2014 - The Facilities Advisory Committee met to narrow the scope of work and recommended we focus on a "Safe, Warm, & Dry" millage campaign for May

November 4, 2014 - The Mona Shores Community renews our sinking fund, which will allow us to take care of general maintenance and operations of the district

November 11, 2014 - The Facilities Advisory Committee met along with parent and community representatives to agree on the highest priorities for the "Safe, Warm, & Dry" millage campaign for May 5th

November 11, 2014 - Millage campaign co-chairs are announced (Melissa Baker, Jenny McNeil, Heidi Mann, & Mark Quigg)

December of 2014 - Board of Action takes action on May 5th millage campaign

A Message from Mary VanderMolen, Director of Special Education

Happy New Year! It's hard to believe that 2014 has come and gone. So far it has been a great year filled with lots of fun and learning. Our students continue to learn and grow academically, socially and emotionally through the support and guidance of all our caring staff.

The Mona Shores Special Education Team continues to work hard on our goal to provide a high quality education for all students. Our focus for the 2014-15 school year is on building relationships as these are the key to progress in any setting. Positive, strong relationships benefit students, school staff, parents and families.

Building positive relationships and rapport with students leads to higher levels of success both inside and outside of the classroom. Students feel safe and secure within the classroom when teachers build those relationships. This in turn will lead to higher levels of self-esteem and confidence for students.

Positive relationships between adults in a school building also lead to better outcomes. These collaborative relationships serve as models for students for teamwork and cooperation as well as showcasing the importance of respect between all members of an organization.

Relationships between school personnel and parents are also critical. Developing these relationships builds trust and opens critical lines of communication that support student learning. Research has shown that increased parent involvement in schools is associated with positive development and academic performance (School Psychology Review, Vol 28(3)).

Positive relationships within the home are also important to school success for children. Consider the Five L's. According to D. Wayne Matthews, Ph.D. there are five things which contribute to strong family relationships. These are Learning, Loyalty, Love, Laughter, and Leadership. Children thrive on feelings of belonging and affection that come from having caring and supportive families. 2015 certainly brings with it a sense of anticipation and excitement as we continue to strive for excellence in all we do as Sailors. Let's continue to work together for the benefit of all. 

CURRICULUM CORNER

A Message from Greg Helmer

State Assessment

With no MEAP testing this fall, the assessment schedule will be busy this spring. In June of 2014, legislation was passed requiring the Michigan Department of Education (MDE) to develop a new summative assessment for use in the Spring of 2015. Students will take the M-STEP (Michigan Student Test of Educational Progress). Unlike the previous MEAP assessments, the new M-STEP assessment will be aligned to Michigan standards, administered in the spring, and measure current year versus previous year student knowledge. English language arts and mathematics will be assessed in grades 3-8 and 11. Science will be assessed in grades 4, 7, and 11; and social studies in grades 5, 8, and 11. Mona Shores Public Schools will be using an online version.

Back in September, the legislation also required the Department of Education to issue a "Request For Proposal" for a new summative assessment system to begin in the 2015-16 school year. We have continued to focus our work on the Common Core in our daily lessons, units, and assessments in preparation for the summative assessment in 2015 - 2016. Depth of knowledge, literacy skills, and critical thinking across the curriculum will be the driving force behind what is essential regardless of content being taught.

The high school college entrance ACT and WorkKeys will be in March and the 3rd grade through 11th grade state assessment window will begin on April 13th and conclude on May 29th with make-ups to follow.

DISTRICT FOCUS AREAS

Earlier this year, the Board of Education adopted 7 focus areas that have been embedded into each of our administrative team's goals for the 2014 - 2015 school year. Each of the goals will continue to be our focus with specific strategies being rolled out to guide our practices, beliefs, actions, and organizational drive strenath.

- 1. To inspire excellence, build character, and impact the future through a successful passage of the facilities (Safe, Warm, & Dry) millage on May 5, 2015.
- 2. To build capacity and prepare for a smooth rollout of Chromebooks and Tablets (Fall of 2015) across the district (Google Drive/Google Docs/Chrome Boxes).
- 3. To increase the quantity and quality of feedback across the district. Reshaping of evaluation processes for teachers designed to simultaneously improve teacher growth and student learning as well as hiring, growing, supporting and retaining a high-performing faculty and staff.
- 4. To provide leadership for learning in all school programs, focusing on culture and climate, as best practices of effective teaching and learning strategies are expected and supported.
- 5. To assess the current quality of curriculum and common assessments in all grade levels, common courses and common grade levels, and to develop an action plan for guaranteeing a consistent educational experience for all students.
- 6. To continue our efforts with continuous school improvement plans and processes across the district.
- 7. To develop long-range financial goals and maintaining high standards of financial stewardship and accountability.

Each of these goals will be embedded in a new long-term district strategic plan that will be completed by July 1, 2015. We will be seeking input from a variety of stakeholders within our school community during this process.



District Technology UPDATE

Exciting technology improvements are taking place at Mona Shores Public Schools! With the passage of the "Technology Enhancement Millage" this past February, 2014, school districts in Muskegon County have been busy visioning, planning, and developing long range plans and budgets for technology. Your support of the millage has provided much needed technology funding for the next ten years!

Listed below is a short summary of the major technology projects that have been completed recently at Mona Shores. These were the first projects funded with the proceeds from the "Technology Enhancement Millage".

- Video phones have been installed at the main building entrance at:
 - Campbell Elementary
 - Lincoln Park Elementary
 - Middle School
 - Ross Park Elementary
- Lock-down buttons have been implemented at each building. This button will contact 911 and immediately lock all exterior doors when depressed.
- We have purchased additional Google Chromebooks and Android Tablet devices as part of our ongoing pilots. We now have a total of (850) Google Chromebooks and Tablets for student use throughout the district.
- High School (6) carts
- Middle School (9) carts
- Campbell Elementary (1) cart and additional chromebooks
- Churchill Elementary (2) carts and (10) android tablets
- Lincoln Park Elementary (2) carts and (10) android tablets
- Ross Park Elementary (1) cart, (40) chromebooks, and (10) android tablets
- The High School Auditorium received \$20,000 towards lighting upgrades.
- The gym at Churchill Elementary has a new video presentation and audio system.
- The High School Cafeteria has a new audio system in place.
- There are more projects yet to take place this year in the area of security camera upgrades and door access enhancements.

Finally, we are currently in the process of putting the finishing touches on a "Digital Learning Plan" for the District. This plan will provide the vision, goals, and strategies for how technology will look at all levels at Mona Shores. We have been conducting pilots the last two years which have provided excellent feedback and input to the creation of this plan. The district is now ready to provide students a device for their personal learning. The plan will provide how this will look at various grade levels. Stay tuned for the sharing of this plan!

What an amazing 1st trimester for our entire school community! There were extraordinary performances in the classroom, on the stage, playing courts and on the fields. Our theme Sailor P.R.I.D.E. ... Sailing to New Horizons has proven to be a perfect fit for the 2014-15 school year. Our Student Senate has taken on a new platform by rolling out the Be Nice program to our school. This program is sponsored by the Michigan Department of Mental Health and has a focus on promoting a positive school culture through an anti bullying message. The Positive Behavior Matrix continues to be a major focus for our staff and students.

Throughout this school year we have been recognizing our student's grades 9-12 for demonstrating




positive behaviors with a PRIDE pass. Students then are entered in random drawings for the chance to win prizes ranging from gift cards to local food restaurants, movie tickets, Lumberjack tickets and the list goes on. The Data is in for 1st trimester and once again there has been a dramatic increase in positive behaviors and a significant decrease in negative behaviors.

- Over 2,000+ Pride passes were distributed by HS staff and received by student's grades 9-12 during the 1st trimester.
- Discipline referrals for the 2014-15 1st trimester have seen a decrease by 30% from the previous year. Important to note that in the 2013-14 school year there was a 50% reduction in discipline referrals.

The Sailor PRIDE behavior matrix is more than just words. It has become a system of beliefs for our students and staff and has proven to impact our entire school culture. 
FAFSA


Paper FAFSA's are only available through download at the Federal Aid website or by calling 1-800-4-FEDAID. About 5% of FAFSA's are now filed by paper with the majority being filed online at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Both the dependent student and parent must apply for a pin number that will serve as an electronic signature. This can be done at www.pin.ed.gov. Keep this in a safe place. It will be used every year that you apply for financial aid.

STUDENT SCHEDULING FOR 2015 - 2016 BEGINS **IN JANUARY**

Counselors will begin meeting with students in scheduling assemblies right after the holiday break. Students will be given a copy of their transcript to review and will be instructed to select their classes for the next school year. Parents can assist their sons and daughters in this process by reviewing their choices, signing the course selection sheet, reminding them to return the materials to school on time and finally scheduling with them online at home. Last year, our students embarked upon online scheduling at home and it was a smooth transition. This is an added benefit as it allows the parents to have more active participation in the scheduling process. Counselors and students will meet individually during this

You can call the Financial Aid Office at Baker College or Muskegon Community College and get help for free on filling out the Financial Aid Form. Beware of people who want to charge you for this service, or who promise to get you Financial Aid if you pay them to complete your form. When in doubt, call first for advice.

Go to www.FAFSA4caster.ed.gov for an early estimate of federal aid eligibility. A pin number is not required and the information can transfer directly to your FAFSA.

FINANCIAL AID WORKSHOP

On Wednesday, January 7, we will have a Financial Aid Workshop at 6:00 PM in the High School Media Center. A Financial Aid Officer will be here to go over the financial aid process and the FAFSA worksheet. Any questions that you have concerning completion of FAFSA and financial aid documents will be discussed.

DO THE FAFSA

College Goal Sunday: February 8 from 2:00 – 4:00 PM at Muskegon Community College. Get help filling out the FAFSA. Bring your family's completed 2014 tax forms (or W2s and 1099s), social security numbers, Driver's licenses, and 2014 untaxed income records to complete the form right there. Students/parents can sign up for personalized message reminders. Also, students who attend the event and complete the Student/Family Survey are entered for a chance to win a \$1000 scholarship, an iPad Mini, and other awards. ACT

Junior Registration: The State of Michigan will pay for all juniors to take the ACT plus Writing test on March 3 during the school day. The ACT plus writing will be the first phase of the Michigan Merit Exam. Juniors will be able to send their scores to four colleges that they are considering attending. They should give this some thought ahead of time because they will be asked to give that information during a February registration process here at the high school.

AFTER SCHOOL TUTORING

Students needing tutoring can get assistance every Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday after school in the Media Center. National Honor Society students are available to tutor in core subjects from 3:00 – 3:45 PM. In addition, there is an after-school or before-school schedule for tutoring in the core subject areas with teachers. Have your student check out these very valuable resources!

THE MICHIGAN COLLEGE ACCESS PORTAL

There is a new statewide initiative that is free and easy-to-use for Michigan students and families to help in the process of planning, applying, and paying for college. It is the Michigan CAP—the Michigan College Access Portal, a web-based system located at www.michgancap.org. For students, it can help organize information, provide free test prep tutorials, research Michigan colleges, plan for careers, research and apply for financial aid, and eventually track and submit college applications online.

SCHOLARSHIP NOTICES

Students will receive scholarship notices for Muskegon Community College and Baker College in March and April. Scholarship notices are posted throughout the building, on our website, and on announcements. Seniors receive personal emails monthly to their school Gmail accounts indicating scholarship availability, requirements and due dates.

COMMUNITY FOUNDATION OF MUSKEGON: Offers a number of scholarships. Most are for seniors going away to a four-year school. Some are for students going to a vocational or technical program. Offers a few merit-based scholarships worth more money. Last year 14 Shores seniors were selected in this program. Financial need often a consideration. Deadline: March 1. Application is now online at Foundation website, www.cffmc.org. Please note applicants must complete the FAFSA by March 1 and list the school they plan to attend so Financial Aid Officer will have necessary information to complete Financial Information form by Foundation's deadline.

MEA SCHOLARSHIPS: Last year 36 scholarships totaling \$30,000 were awarded based upon leadership, community service, and academics. Preference is given to children of MEA members. Applications are available in the Counseling Office. Deadline: February 8, 2015

MICHIGAN COMPETITIVE SCHOLARSHIP: Any senior who attained a 23 composite on the ACT is eligible for this scholarship. This is renewable and worth up to \$1300 per year. Students must attend a Michigan public college and show financial need. You must file the FAFSA, and it must be received by March 1. Social security numbers are required. See your counselor for details.

GERBER FOUNDATION MERIT SCHOLARSHIP: At least one \$2,000 scholarship for a Mona Shores senior - five Mona Shores High School students earned these scholarships last year - with a maximum 3.7 GPA in order to target the average to above average student. Winners selected on basis of overall academic record, recommendations, leadership qualities, and involvement in curricular, extracurricular, and community activities. Preference given to those with little scholarship support. Essay and financial statement required. Deadline: to Gerber Foundation by February 28 (online application required at www. gerberfoundation.org)

AMERICAN LEGION SCHOLARSHIPS: American Legion gives a number of \$500 scholarships to children and sometimes grandchildren of Veterans. Go to www.michiganlegion.org/scholarships and www.michalaux.org for more information.

WOMEN'S DIVISION CHAMBER OF COMMERCE: Five \$1000 scholarships will be awarded. Applicants must have at least a 3.0 GPA and reside in Muskegon County. Applicants must also plan to attend either Muskegon Community College, Baker College or a Muskegon County Technical school in Muskegon full time. Applications are available in the Counseling Office or online at www.womensdivision.org. Deadline March 16.

TUITION INCENTIVE PROGRAM (TIP): This is an incentive program that encourages eligible students to complete high school providing tuition assistance for the first two years of college and beyond. To meet the financial eligibility requirement, a student must have (or have had) Medicaid coverage for 24 months within a 36-consecutive month period as identified by the Michigan Department of Human Services. If you think your student may be eligible please contact their high school counselor.



A Message from Ryan Portenga, Director of Athletics

Considering the current amount of pride within our school community, I was reminded these past few months how much of an impact a school's athletic program can make. Granted, from girls swimming to boys' tennis to sideline cheerleading, Mona Shores has a lot to be proud of and thankful for. Yet, when a team makes a run to the state finals – like football's Team 52 did this past November – let's just say I don't mind shopping at Meijer during peak hours as much.

In particular, there are two moments amid the football circus we enjoyed this past sports season that stand out and make me incredibly proud to serve and live in this school district.



First, while others looked to move their regional final football contest to facilities with artificial turf due to the heavy snow that fell along the lakeshore, our community rallied to give our seniors one last chance to play a home game in Sailor Stadium. The funny thing is that it wasn't just parents who answered the cry for help – the aide came in all forms... taxpayers, alumni, non-residents, and elementary students. Everyone wanted to be a part of the effort. Considering the fact that Shores had only hosted one other playoff football contest – two weeks earlier (against Caledonia) – Sailor Nation was not about to take the opportunity to host another for granted.

Second, in between Middle School and High School rallies for the football team on Wednesday, November 26, almost 70 players and cheerleaders walked the hallways of their former elementary schools... high-fiving students, hugging their former teachers, and posing for photos with fans. Such action reduced so many people – including me – to tears

Simply put, Mona Shores is a wonderful and proud school community – always has and always will be – but, for some goofy reason, high school sports makes communities like ours even stronger. Thank you, Sailor Nation; for all that you did for our school community these past few months. You were Team 52's inspiration.

HIGHLIGHTS

Many within and around our school community will remember this past autumn sports season for our football program's state championship run to Ford Field. Considering the program's history, the number of people involved, and the emotional journey that started in Saline and ended in Detroit (taking us through a rainstorm in Rockford and a snowstorm against Battle Creek Lakeview in between), I don't blame them. However, this past October was thick with highlights all over the athletic spectrum.

On October 8, after a year of transition, our girls' golf program returned to the MHSAA State Finals by blasting their regional competition at Lincoln Golf Club – besting runner-up Forest Hills Central by 25 strokes. Rylee George (81) capped a terrific senior year by earning medalist honors at the event while Coach Scott Volkmann hoisted our school's 6th

MHSAA Regional trophy in the sport with his team. Despite the cold and windy conditions, it was a warm moment for Sailor Nation.

On October 9, sophomores Nick DeBruin and Kobe Gossett (#2 Doubles) upset top-seeded Rockford in straight sets in an early round of MHSAA Regionals and cruised through the rest of the bracket to a flight championship – adding their names to an already proud list of Mona Shores regional tennis champions. Their feet were quick throughout the day and the ball thunderously exploded off their racquets throughout each game... it was amazing to see these two youngsters compete with and defeat the best of West Michigan.

On October 14, with the game scoreless and the clock winding down, junior Eric Conley buried a crossing pass by senior all-state player Nate Hoover to knock off West Ottawa in the opening match of the MHSAA Tournament. Those of us that were a few yards away leaning on the north fence saw a thing of beauty when Conley tucked the header just under the crossbar. As Coach Jeremy Leffring steps down after over a decade of leading our boys' soccer program, that emotional goal and victory was more than fulfilling.

On October 18, Coach Dan Potts had his volleyball squad rolling in the county tournament. His girls crushed the competition – besting Fruitport in the finals, 25-20, 25-13, 25-14 – never dropping a set. Eventually, the girls would also win their fourth straight conference championship and witness senior all-state hitter Courtney Brewer set a school record in kills (519) and junior Kennedy Potts set a school record in digs (538). No matter the contest, those girls played with an intensity unmatched on the opposite side of the net.

On October 22, although perhaps overlooked or viewed as irrelevant, over 100 girls participated in our annual Powderpuff Football contest and provided plenty of entertainment for our school community. For goodness sakes, freshman Ryleigh Wehler nearly quarterbacked the freshman squad to two victories! On a serious note though, it is just amazing to see our school pride shine through in events like this. Lifelong memories were certainly made!

On October 24, under the historic lights of Hackley Stadium – a venue Mona Shores had not won at since 1968 – our football team decimated the powerhouse Big Reds of Muskegon High School en route to their first conference championship in football since... well, the same year. With a shared vision, a unique blend of skill and leadership, and plenty of resilience (considering the program's 1-8 record in Coach Koziak's first year at the reigns), it was a magical night.

On October 25, junior Jackie Seward earned a repeat trip to Michigan International Speedway – annual site of the MHSAA State Finals in Cross-Country – by finishing 14th (19:32) at Regionals in Traverse City. Despite a tough course – along with wet and muddy conditions – this gritty student-athlete (4.0 GPA!) rose to the top of the competition to keep Shores Cross-Country relevant among state programming.

Finally, on October 28, longtime girls swimming coach Margie Collison cheered her girls on for the last time in a conference match as our program's figurehead. Coaching swimming at Mona Shores – without a pool, without respectable equipment, with fragmented youth and feeder programs – is not easy. Collison was head of the program when Muskegon High School ran our swimming cooperative and continued to stay on when the organization took a different shape. For over a decade, Collison has run things professionally and with unmatched enthusiasm – considering the challenges.

We have tremendous coaches within our athletic department, but Shores is losing two solid leaders in Leffring and Collison. Thank you both for your efforts over the years!

ADMISSIONS REMINDER

Athletic passes for the Winter and Spring campaigns are once again on sale in the Athletic Office and are good for the 2014-15 school year. These passes get you into any Mona Shores athletic event other than hockey games and county/state tournaments and the information is also posted on our athletic website. The cost remains \$40 for student passes, \$80 for a single adult pass, and \$180 for a family pass. Even if you have not already purchased them, they are a bargain if you intend to be at numerous Winter events.





A Message from Middle School Principal Doug Ammeraal

Since the start of the new school year, Mona Shores Middle School has been intentionally focused on recognizing positive behavior, developing character traits, and helping all students reach their level of academic success. Not only have our students done a phenomenal job, but our teachers have been equally phenomenal in recognizing positive behavior and supporting our students success.

Here is just a snapshot of the data and initiatives for the new school year.

- POSITIVE RECOGNITION staff members have given out over 7,500 SAIL Slips to our students for positive behavior, for meeting expectations. This does not include the 100 Shout Outs that have been given out for going above and beyond (students can win Jimmy Johns or Texas Roadhouse for these). Additionally, we have recognized students through Jimmy John's, Texas Roadhouse, Ride with Pride, and our Students of the Month. It is truly inspiring to work with such high caliber students and teachers.
- DISCIPLINE NUMBERS through the first Trimester, we have 245 fewer discipline write ups than last year and 291 fewer than two years ago. Through many conversations, I believe this is evidence of all the positive recognition from teachers, implementation of CHAMPS building-wide, focused character traits for the building, and a great group of students at MSMS.
- ACADEMICS through the hard work of our students, parents, and teachers, along with a variety of supports here at school (SOS, tutoring, lunch work, etc.), we had only 2.7% of our student population receive a failing grade ("F"). I am very proud of the collective responsibility, effort, and commitment towards academic success. As we move into a new Trimester, our goal shifts to drop that percentage even lower.
- SCHOOL STORE (THE LIGHTHOUSE) last month we had our grand opening of The Lighthouse, our school store. This allowed students to purchase Sailor-items using their SAIL Slips from positive behavior, or to save them up for a larger prize next Trimester. Many items available were purchased or donated for students to choose from. If you'd like to help support The Lighthouse, please contact Mr. Ammeraal. A special 'Thank You' to our parent volunteers that helped us over the two days!

As you can see, our staff and students are having an incredible year. Thank you to our students and their families for the continued behavior and academic support at home.

KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

Over the past few years, legislation has changed the entry age for students to enroll in kindergarten. In 2015-16 a child must be 5 on or before September 1, 2015 to register for kindergarten.

Parents can learn more about kindergarten at our upcoming parent meetings. The building principal, teachers and other district staff will relay details of a typical kindergarten day, what students will learn and be expected to have mastered prior to first grade and questions about transportation. This year kindergarten round-up meetings are scheduled in each building on the following dates:

Lincoln Park Elementary: Tuesday, March 3, 2015 @ 6:00 p.m. (755-1257)

Campbell Elementary: Wednesday, March 4, 2015 @ 6:00 p.m. (755-2550)

Churchill Elementary: Thursday, March 12, 2015 @ 6:00 p.m. (798-1276)

Ross Park Elementary: Thursday, March 12, 2015 @ 6:00 p.m. (798-1773)

In Mona Shores the enrollment process begins with your elementary building secretary. She will provide you with an enrollment packet to complete and return to the school prior to round-up. Please feel free to call or drop by your home building and to pick up this enrollment packet today. Along with the completed packet you will be asked to provide birth certificate (original), immunization record (including hearing and vision screening results), and proof of residency (i.e., warranty deed to mortgage, most recently paid property tax statement, rental lease or agreement, mortgage payment receipt, or affidavit of residency with property owner).


Transportation is provided to resident kindergarten students who reside beyond the 1.5 mile walk out distance. For the safety of your kindergartener, you or a guardian must be present at both pick-up and dropoff locations. Additional information will be provided regarding transportation at a later date.

"Six Words You Should Say Today"


