This year has brought many changes to the music program at Ross Park and Churchill. For the first time, students are able to participate in choir at 4th and 5th grade. Ross Park started at 80 students and has grown to 95 and Churchill has 60! They have gone caroling, given a concert, and are currently preparing for a choir festival, 2 additional concerts, and singing the national anthem for the Lumberjacks and West Michigan Whitecaps. Additionally, 3 students from Ross Park and 5 from Churchill have been selected to participate in the first annual Michigan Music Education Association (MMEA) Elementary Honors Choir. These 8 students will join over 120 from all over the state in this inaugural event. It truly has been a great year for choir!

Outside of choir, classroom music classes are also flourishing. All 4-year-old preschool students receive music once a week and a class has also been specially designed for special needs students. The 5th graders put on a huge holiday program, and 1st and 2nd grades are busily preparing for their own. The year will be capped off with the Michigan Musical performed by 3rd grade students.

MAY 5TH BOND ISSUE

WHAT ARE WE VOTING ON? The Board of Education has approved a May 5th Bond Issue to provide infrastructure improvements, buses, furnishings and new equipment which are needed throughout the district. This will provide our students with a "Warm, Safe and Dry" environment for learning . The sale of bonds is different from the sinking fund passed last November which does not address the additional needs of the school district. The .75 mill increase will generate \$13,110,000 and will be paid off in less than 15 years.

Mona Shores Green Team Update

The Mona Shores Green Team is a volunteer group of students, staff and community members, dedicated to making our schools safer, healthier and more sustainable places to work and learn. The Green Team started in the spring of 2012 and has made great progress, thanks to the hard work and dedication of staff, students and parents.

Our first project was to start a district-wide recycling program for paper, plastic and cardboard. Groups of students in every building are doing a great job of collecting and recycling paper and plastic every week. The recycling is coordinated by staff members in each building. Nancy Grigsby at Campbell, Tracey Miller at Churchill, Tim Zinger at Lincoln Park, Jill McMahon



at Ross Park, Cheryl Brink and Colleen Hoffer at the Middle School and Lisa Caruso and Pat Rabbitt at the High School. Some of the buildings are tracking the weight of their recycling. For example, at the Middle School, Colleen Hoffer's students collected and recycled 7,124 pounds of paper and Cheryl Brink's students collected and recycled 553 pounds of plastic during the 2013-2014 school year! Nancy Grigsby's students at Campbell collected and recycled 2,005 pounds of paper! Great job!

We received a grant from the Community Foundation for Muskegon County that was used to purchase recycling bins imprinted with the Green Team logo. Look for them throughout the district. We then convinced the school board and our food service team, Chartwells, to change from Styrofoam lunch trays and plates to healthier, compostable ones. Styrofoam is not only unhealthy to eat from, but it is also very bad for the environment. We would like to thank the school board and Chartwells for their support!

We built and planted our first community garden at Ross Park Elementary during the summer of 2013. Our organic garden is now starting its third summer. We are very happy to announce that we have just received a \$2000 grant for the Ross Park Garden! The grant is from the Whole Kids Foundation. We are very excited and will be making some wonderful improvements to our garden this summer!



The garden was built with the help of donations from the Ross Park PTO and The Greater Grand Rapids Food Systems Council, and generous discounts

on building materials and black dirt from SethCo Lumber and Summit Lawn Care. Several volunteers from the Green Team helped us build and fill the raised beds. Many of the classrooms at Ross Park help every spring by growing a flat of seeds. We then plant these in our garden. Students from child care help out by watering and weeding over the summer.

Last summer was a tremendous success and we harvested tomatoes, carrots and kohlrabi well into October. Classes at Ross Park enjoyed the garden in many ways, such as reading in the garden, eating tomatoes, harvesting purple carrots and kohlrabi and taste sampling in their classroom. Mrs. Eckerman's, Mrs. Eigenauer's and Mrs. Young's third grade classes harvested carrots and cabbage last fall. They had a tasting of the veggies in their classroom and then we froze the rest. They then used these veggies in their Stone Soup that they made in the classrooms in January. The kids really enjoyed seeing the vegetables go from the garden in the fall to their soup in the winter.

This summer promises to be even more bountiful! We hope to have a few events in the garden over the summer, such as salsa making, like we did last summer. the main goals of the garden is to teach students where their food comes from and how they can grow it themselves. We hope to make the garden bigger and better every year!

We are very happy to announce that Mona Shores now has community gardens at Lincoln Park and Campbell too! The gardens at Lincoln Park were coordinated by Lincoln Park teacher Amy Recor, High School teacher Shannan Conrad, and their students. The gardens at Campbell were installed last summer. Several classrooms at Campbell grew seedlings in large, indoor gardens that were built by parent volunteers. They were then converted to outdoor raised beds.

We also helped in the planning of a native wildflower garden outside of the main entrance to the new administration offices at Ross Park Elementary, during the fall of 2013. Sara Busken's high school ecology students dug up the sod and planted the garden in September, and they did a great job!

We are very excited to announce our latest project! We are starting a Cooking Club at the Middle School! The club will be open to students, parents and staff. We will meet once a week and focus on learning about real, unprocessed food. What it is, where it comes from, how to grow it, and how to cook it. We will then sit down together and eat it!

A Message from Mary VanderMolen, Director of Special Education

Moving and Learning

Special Education is mandated by both Federal and State law. As a result of these laws, the use of funds and staff are closely regulated and monitored. There are, however, many instances when all kids can benefit from the expertise and

training of our teaching and related service staff. One way we are doing this in Mona Shores is through the use of the S'Cool Moves program. Our Occupational Therapists, Jessica Pascavis-Kever and JoAnn Hradsky, have attended the S'Cool Moves training and are sharing their knowledge in many Mona Shores classrooms. Below is an article written by Jessica explaining the importance of movement to the learning process and the impact of this "Cool" program.

SAILORS BRING MOVEMENT TO THE CLASSROOM WITH S'COOL MOVES

"Why does movement play such an important role in the process of learning?" As school-based occupational therapists, this is one of our favorite questions to answer. For decades we have understood how physical activity impacts our students' physical health and development. Now, as we enter an era of significant changes nationally to our education system we are learning how physical activity affects cognitive development.

So why is movement so important? Movement is like food to our brains. Research tells us that more of the brain is activated when the body is moving and that movement helps

the brain build and strengthen neural connections. Thus, what is learned can be

more easily remembered and retrieved; students can stay more alert, and are more motivated to learn.

As occupational therapists, we are proud to work in a District where the value of movement to learning is respected. We have always observed our teachers using movement breaks, but when we had the opportunity to implement a new movement program called S'Cool Moves we were thrilled with our teachers' enthusiastic responses.

S'Cool Moves is a research-based program developed by Debra Em Wilson, a reading specialist, and Margot Heiniger-White, an occupational therapist. S'Cool Moves' Minute Moves series is designed to improve learning by providing students with simple, quick movement routines to use throughout the school day for kindergarten through fifth grade. It also allows students to be leaders. These

moves help to improve focus and reduce stress, making learning easier. Routines address fine motor skills, core strength, motor coordination and provide input to the sensory systems. For instance, the "Core on the Floor Routine" helps to strengthen core postural muscles to create a strong, stable base for writing and reading. Students engage in strengthening moves on their backs and bellies on the floor. It is a fun routine that also increases the energy needed for cognitive processes such as in Writer's Workshop.

After attending the S'Cool Moves training in October 2014, we began piloting the program in elementary classrooms throughout the District. Our teachers' willingness to let us in their classrooms and effort in implementing these moves into their daily routines has been amazing. The feedback about the effectiveness of these movement routines has been overwhelmingly positive. Jill Jacobson, a third grade teacher at Campbell School explains, "We use the mirror me moves every day. Students love to be the one leading! After lunch, students remember to get their brains ready for learning by doing the moves. We love it!". "In our class, we like to use S'cool Moves during our rotation and transition times. I have seen a huge improvement

in the calmness of my students. They love the moves and look forward to it," reports a kindergarten teacher at Campbell School, AnneMarie Sikora. Andrea Wells, another kindergarten teacher at Ross Park, says, "This program is great for my kindergarteners because it helps them focus, calm down, and build strength in their muscles. I have seen improvements in handwriting, posture and energy release."

We look forward to continuing with implementation of S'Cool Moves in the elementary schools with new opportunities in different classrooms. A quote taken from the S'Cool Moves website puts it best, "The mind can absorb no more than the seat can endure." (Janet Trasli). Keep moving Sailors!



DISTRICT TECHNOLOGY UPDATE

Mona Shores Public Schools is forging a new path for our students and staff as we undergo a digital learning transformation throughout the district. Knowing this, we have developed a "Digital Learning Plan" that includes vision, goals, strategies, and outcomes for digital learning especially targeted at increasing student access to technology. We have four major goals that will drive this plan:

- Improve student's proficiency in digital literacy, collaboration, communication, critical thinking, creativity, global awareness and digital citizenship through personalized learning and equal access to technology
- Provide extended and expanded learning opportunities beyond the school day; "any place, any pace, anytime, anywhere" student learning environment
- Provide students the technology tools that will prepare them to be college and career ready
- Provide a learning environment that will transform the instructional delivery of rich curriculum content, information, and resources

To ensure the success of this plan we will need to innovate in the areas of robust infrastructures, powerful professional development, necessary culture shifts, high quality tech support, dynamic digital resources, and empowering 21st century leadership. We are currently visioning and designing how technology will look at the elementary level using pilots. The plan is very fluid and will be constantly changing and evolving as we move forward. In summary, this Fall 2015, students at the high school will have a device issued to them, middle school students will have access to devices located on a cart in each classroom, and elementary students will have increased access to devices via carts and centers.

I would like to thank the Digital Learning Team for their contributions and time. Many decisions and much work has been completed with much more being planned. MONA SHORES ENERGY CONSERVATION PROGRAM UPDATE

Mona Shores implemented a rigorous energy savings program in February of 2012 with the help of a company, Cenergistic, which specializes in organizational behavior-based energy conservation for school systems, higher education, and healthcare organizations. Our school board took proactive steps to reduce the amount

of money we spend on utilities by adopting a policy stating the priority of energy conservation and entering into a partnership with Cenergistic. We determined to undertake this conservation effort because energy costs are rising and our utility costs are second only to salaries in our annual budget.

Our goal is simple, yet challenging: Reduce our energy consumption and therefore the cost of our utilities without affecting the comfort of our classrooms or our educational goals. I am pleased to report our efforts are succeeding and we are realizing significant financial savings. We are glad to share with you that as of December, 2014, Mona Shores has saved over \$320,000! This is money that can be used for education, instead of being spent on utilities.

We have cut energy consumption by 13.1%. We expect these savings to grow as we further refine our program...but it's more than just financial savings. We are helping preserve the environment. According to the EPA, our decrease in energy use is the equivalent of taking 542 cars off the highways for one year or planting 66,000 trees in our community!

Our sense of accomplishment is gratifying, but there is more conservation to pursue. Our efforts will continue throughout the future because our taxpayers, faculty, staff, parents and students deserve to see every dollar possible sent to the classroom.

A Message from Bill O'Brien, Director of Curriculum, Instruction, & Assessment



YEAR ONE OF NEW K-5 MATH CURRICULUM A SUCCESS!!!

Mona Shores elementary students were greeted last Fall with a new Math Curriculum called Math Expressions. Special thanks to the Mona Shores Education Foundation for donating \$30,000 to help make this purchase possible! Math Expressions is a nationally recognized elementary math curriculum that combines aspects of traditional approaches with the most powerful elements of standards-based instruction. This program emphasizes deeper understanding through real-world problems, modeling, Math Talk, and exploration in order to build ideas that make sense to students.

In addition to the great elements outlined above, Math Expressions has also allowed for every elementary family in Mona Shores to be assured of a common curriculum in Math. What this means is as a District we know that every student is learning the same content, in the same grade level, at the same time, regardless of which Mona Shores elementary he or she attends. At the same time we are also able to assess their learning in a common way in order to determine strengths, weaknesses, and additional supports that can ensure success for all students. This commonality across the District is extremely powerful and has resulted in some outstanding early success.

We monitor the performance of every student on end of unit assessments in order to monitor effective instruction, ensure deep understanding, and make necessary changes. Up to this point in the school year our Mona Shores students have scored an incredible average of 86% on all of their end of Unit Assessments. To put that in perspective it is important to know that there have been nearly 5,000 Unit Assessments total taken as a District this year and our students have scored an average of 86% overall.

Huge kudos to our school community (students, parents, and teachers) for their commitment to this new Math program! As a TEAM we have taken on this challenge and the results are clear that it has been a SUCCESS for our Mona Shores students.

MONA SHORES PREPARES FOR A NEW STATE ASSESSMENT, M-STEP

Many of you will remember the MEAP Test that students took annually for 40 years in the state of Michigan. Beginning this April, Michigan is moving to a new state assessment known as the Michigan Student Test of Educational Progress, better known as M-STEP.

The M-STEP will assess students in grades 3-8 in English language arts (reading, writing, and listening) and mathematics. Science will be assessed in grades 4 and 7 and Social Studies in grades 5 and 8. Grade 11 will be assessed in all 4 core areas (ELA, Math, Science and Social Studies) in addition to the MME/ACT which is taken the first week of March.

The M-STEP signifies a move from assessing previous year growth in the Fall each year to assessing in the Spring in order to measure the growth of a student during the current year. The M-STEP is a summative assessment meaning it is meant to measure how much a student has grown (learned) during that particular school year. The M-STEP will consist of 3 parts (On-line testing session, Classroom Activity, and Performance Task). Mona Shores students will be taking the assessment on-line using Chromebooks this school year. The opportunity to have score reports much quicker is one huge benefit of the on-line testing format.

Mona Shores will be fully prepared for the M-STEP from a student, staff, and technology perspective. It will be exciting to see the performance of our Sailors across the District as they take on this new state assessment.

BUILDING USE

Over the past few years, requesting gym space has been a struggle for a number of different organizations and parties. Although we have tried to accommodate all requests - whether they are youth basketball practice, a softball hitting session, or even a birthday party - our reservation system hasn't been the easiest to work with. I am pleased to announce that - through work with multiple departments within our school district - we will have a one-stop-shop for everyone.

Beginning June 1, 2015, interested parties may see the schedule for all gyms on our school's main page - www.monashores.net - located under our district calendar. Also, folks will have access to a reservation form that is electronically submitted to our athletic offices.

Considering all of our school teams that use the facilities, some might wonder how our department will go about approving requests. Although it is spelled out on the request form, the priority list is as follows...

- 1. Building level district-sponsored sports teams
- 2. Non-building level district-sponsored sports teams
- 3. Administrative needs
- 4. Building level school programs
- 5. District employees
- 6. Outside organizations

Finally, to calm fears that some might have about getting a request in on time, our department will sift through requests - and then use the priority list - five times a year... on June 1 for SUMMER requests; on September 1 for FALL requests; on November 1 for WINTER I requests; on January 1 for WINTER II requests; and on March 1 for SPRING requests. This way, high school and middle school schedules will be in place - along with bigger events our district is hosting (Destination Imagination, MHSAA Tournaments, etc.) - and our other district youth and recreation organizations can gobble up empty space!

Please remember that certain rental and custodial fees still apply - contact our Community Services office for details - but our goal is that our space is used by our taxpayers!

FOOTBALL TICKET INFORMATION

With home games against **West Ottawa**, **Rockford**, **Zeeland East**, **Reeths-Puffer**, **and Muskegon** - hopefully playoffs as well - tickets for next year's football season have already been in demand. Although general admission rates will not change - \$5 for adults and \$3 for students - we have instituted a few changes regarding the sale of reserved seating - very similar to the way Muskegon High School runs their operation.

First, all tickets in the reserved seating section will be on sale in the high school athletic office starting August 1. If you purchase season tickets - all five home games - the cost is \$6 per ticket. Please note that there is no discount for staff members, students, or senior citizens. These pre-sale reserved seating tickets are \$6 each. Also note that these tickets are \$7 if purchased the day of the game.

Second, beginning Wednesday, August 26, all tickets - reserved and general admission - will be sold outside at the main ticket booth - not in the high school office. On weeks where we have a home varsity football game, this booth will be open from 3:30-5:30 pm on Wednesdays and Thursdays. On Friday - game day - the booth will be open at 3:00 pm and will sell throughout the game.

Last year, we hosted almost 30,000 spectators between our four regular season home games and our two playoff games. We fully expect to host that and then some this year - so we're just trying to stay ahead of the curve. Thank you for your patience and understanding!

tool that assesses students' academic readiness for college. The ACT consists of four multiple choice tests: English, Mathematics, Reading, and Science. In addition, there is a 30 minute writing test which emphasizes the writing skills taught in high school English courses and in entry level college composition courses. New to the Michigan Department of Education assessment system is the M-Step. The M-Step summative assessments will measure student growth in English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies; it replaces Day 3 of the MME. In addition, these assessments will give teachers a data resource to use in evaluating curriculum, monitoring how students are learning, and making the necessary adjustments to assist in student achievement and provide students and their parents with college readiness predictors. 

SCHOLARSHIP FORMS

Any senior who has received a scholarship should fill out the "Award Form" in order to be recognized at the Honors Convocation. These forms will be available in early May. Please list all scholarship earnings and awards that you have been granted to date, whether you have accepted them or not as well as whether you are attending the college or not. Do not include loans or Pell Grants. It is important that you write legibly and include the full name of the scholarship/award including the college name if applicable.

FINAL TRANSCRIPTS

All Seniors will be meeting with their counselor in May as part of the Senior Exit Interview process. At this meeting, Seniors should inform their counselor which college must receive a final transcript.

SCHOLARSHIPS

There are still a small number of scholarships listed on our Counseling Department website with applications available in our office or online. Please remember that you should allow 5-7 days prior to the deadline for processing.

ACT

Juniors planning to take the June 13th ACT must submit their registration online by May 8th at www.actstudent.org. Mona Shores High School's code is 232-704. The basic fee for the ACT (no writing) is \$38 and ACT plus writing is \$54.50.

COLLEGE AWARENESS WEEK/ COLLEGE DECISION DAY



Mona Shores High School participates in the statewide initiatives with the goal to have every graduating high school senior complete at least one college application. On College Decision Day (May 1), we ask each senior to notify

our Counseling Office of their post high school plans. College Decision Day coincides with the date that most seniors are to inform a college of their plan to enroll. Please confirm with your student that they've submitted their name and college attending.

FINANCIAL AID

The financial aid process begins with submitting the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online after January 1 of the year you plan to enroll. The FAFSA evaluates eligibility for need-based aid, including federal loans, and gives students access to need-based grants, scholarships, loans, and work-study. For assistance in completing your FAFSA, please contact either Baker College or attend one of MCC's FAFSA Friday sessions. These services are available to the community (student need not be planning to attend either college for assistance).

COUNSELING OFFICE WEBSITE

Please refer to our website: http://www.monashores.net/our-schools/ mona-shores-high-school/hs-departments/counseling/ to find the latest scholarship application information, financial aid, E-transcripts, NCAA and testing information. There are also links for scholarship searches. If students are interested in updating their EDP's, they should go to the MICAP site under the Media Center Department. We now also include written course descriptions for all classes that we offer at the high school in an effort to become more eco-friendly and efficient as well.

SUMMER SCHOOL

Information regarding summer school at Mona Shores High School will be available in the Counseling Office and on our website after Spring Break. This is an outstanding opportunity for students to either do credit recovery for one or two classes or do credit enhancement to get ahead in their coursework. Each class spans a three-week time period, and it is imperative that students attend every session. Check out the website for the fees, specific dates, and the courses being offered, or contact your student's counselor.

CREDIT RECOVERY CLASSES

Students who have failed classes or are behind in credits may elect to take an online course after school through the High School's credit recovery program. The student needs to see his/her counselor to complete an application and determine which course needs to be taken. Each half-credit course costs \$100 to cover the cost of the class and the instructor who is available Monday through Thursday from 3:00–4:30 p.m. All work needs to be completed at school and should be finished within a trimester's time.

TESTING OUT OF CLASSES

Testing out of classes provides students with an opportunity to earn a credit in a course by passing an examination during the summer. The student must complete a request form (available in the Athletic Office later this month) and then turn it in to Ms. Marine along with a refundable \$25 check. The student will be given a packet of study materials, including a book, prior to the end of the school year. Students must earn an 80% or better on the exam in order to receive credit for the course. The examinations are generally scheduled for the latter part of July.
