

HAVE YOU HEARD ABOUT MeL?



MeL is the awesome "Michigan Electronic Library" found at **http://mel.org**. Use your Michigan driver's license or

state ID number any time for free access to amazing sources of all kinds - - like tens of thousands of magazines and newspapers, books, historic records, practice ACT and citizenship test, and teacher resources.

One example: car lovers have long used print versions of Chilton Repair Manuals. Now electronic versions of hundreds of these manuals are available in the MeL database Chilton library.

Maybe we don't feel qualified to tackle the repair, maintenance and body work brought on by potholes, snow drifts, and road salt but want to be well-informed when hiring a professional and have an idea of



what's involved. Or maybe we'd like to tackle it, but need step by step instructions, illustrations and specifications.

Chiltons includes all of the above, plus labor estimation, bulletins-/recalls, wiring and vacuum diagrams, photographs and more. And it's all free and on-line from MeL, the Michigan Electronic Library.
