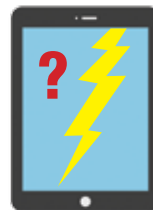

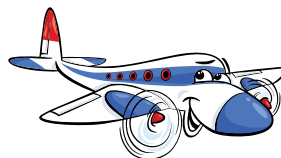

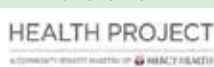

MICHIGAN ACTIVITY PASSES

Do you have a library card? Now you can use it to get Michigan Activity Passes, one-day passes to explore – at no cost or reduced cost – hundreds of Michigan's state parks,

historic sites, cultural attractions, campgrounds and recreation areas.

Go on-line from home or a participating public library, enter your library card number, and print passes for reduced price or free admission to more than 100 participating cultural institutions as well as one-time free entry into any Michigan state park or recreation area. Passes are valid for up to one week.

Over 370 different museums, farm centers, ships, parks, concert halls and more from all across the state are participating. You can take the Shepler's Mackinac Island ferries, tour the Jiffy Mix factory or the Detroit Science Museum, and much more.

Muskegon area participating destinations include the Lakeshore Museum Center locations, the Muskegon Heritage Museum, the Muskegon Museum of Art, the USS Silversides Submarine Museum, the White River Light House Station and all three state parks.
