




Right after the book sale, the gathering place meeting rooms on the lower level will be closed until late fall.





In 1890 on

draped businesses, banks, courts, city and county offices closed their doors at noon. Three railway coaches made a special excursion from Grand Rapids...The drum

corps of the Phil Kearney Post boomed for attention and led the way (from the library) to the Opera House where the dedication was held due to threatened rain. As that building could accommodate only those with admission cards, the Chronicle reported that 'hundreds and hundreds were turned away'. (Marilyn Andersen, author of the centennial history of the Hackley *Public Library*)

Robert Bunker was the Master of Ceremonies for a lengthy program.

There was a public reception in the library given by the board of education from 8:00 to 10:00 pm. Charles and Julia Hackley were the first and second to sign the library guest book. The next day, October 16, 1890 at 8:30 am Hackley Public Library opened for business.
