# Assessment in Mona Shores

TEST. A word we all remember well no matter where or when we went to school. These days the word assessment is used for test. Assessments come in many shapes, sizes, formats, and purposes. Below you will find a list of types of assessments with examples along with the purpose of this type of assessment in Mona Shores:


TYPE OF ASSESSMENT	EXAMPLES	PURPOSE
Formative	Thumbs up or down in a classroom, ungraded quiz, exit ticket	These assessments drive instruction for teachers. They occur frequently and often students do not even know it is an "assessment". Teachers use this data to help them decide where to take the lesson next. This is the most important type of assessment and is ongoing.
Summative	End of chapter test, Final exam, Unit test	These assessments provide a summary of the learning for students in an entire class. They also can inform teachers and parents of the learning that occurred during a set period of time.
Universal Screener	DIBELS, Lexia, iSTEEP, NWEA	These assessments are sorting tools for teachers to use to determine students that need to dig deeper within a certain area (math or reading) to ensure success.
State Standardized	M-STEP (formerly MEAP)	These types of summative assessments provide "big picture" checks on how an entire State or County is performing. They are not meant to drive instruction or decisions for individual students. They are merely a snapshot on a particular day.
College Entrance	SAT/ACT	These types of assessments are meant to be indicators of potential for success at the next level of education or work. They can also help summarize the average "college readiness" for a larger group (such as an entire high school).

As you can see from the above list, assessment has become a big word in the world of education. The following are a few key drivers for Mona Shores in terms of assessment:

• Mona Shores continues to place our emphasis on local "formative assessments". These assessments occur constantly throughout the school day and provide immediate feedback that teachers can use to determine what each student needs to be successful.

- Summative assessments, such as the M-STEP, are not impact data for us. These summative assessment scores are simply a snapshot of a student's performance on that particular test on that particular day. We will not make instructional decisions based upon this data.
- Mona Shores has always, and will continue to have, the HIGHEST expectations for our students in terms of academics and behavior. Our rigorous local assessments, along with the highest ACT (now SAT) scores in the county, are true indicators for us when it comes to individual student success.


In Mona Shores, students are much more than a singular test score and we will continue to focus on doing what is best for each individual child. Trust that your child's teacher or teachers know your child better than any assessment could ever indicate. # Mona Shores Technology Update 2016



It has been over 2 years since the voters of Muskegon County supported the school technology and security millage. Mona Shores has been incredibly active and fortunate with our portion of these incredibly important funds. Below you will find a summary of some of the major projects that have resulted because of this vital millage:

- 3,750 Chromebooks for students
  - K-3: each classroom has 10 Chromebooks
  - 4-5: each classroom has a cart of 30
  - 6-8: each classroom has a cart of 30
  - 9-12: each student has a Chromebook assigned with a case
- Classroom Smart Cart Computer Upgrades (215 Chromeboxes and licenses)
- Secure entrance systems at all buildings (video phone systems)
- Video surveillance system updated with additional cameras as needed throughout District
- Individual headphones to be used with Chromebooks for each student K-5
- Teacher training and support in applications that enhance student learning
- Annual subscriptions to online learning platforms (Lexia, XtraMath, AR, STAR, MobyMax)

- Annual MAISD Server/SAN/Firewall Hosting and Support costs
- Support/Clerical Staff Computer Upgrades (55 upgrades)
- Chromebooks for all elementary staff and other district staff
- GoGuardian Chromebook management and filtering
- Presentation system Churchill Elementary Gym (PTO assisted)
- High School Auditorium Upgrades and High School Cafeteria Audio/ Technology Upgrades
- Infrastructure updates to support increase in devices District-wide

#### Coming in Summer 2016 and beyond:

- Phone system upgrade (current system is nearing end of life)
- Network switching upgrade to better support our blended learning environment and future technologies
- Increase amount of teacher training and support in blended learning and use of technology in the classroom to support and enhance learning
- Performing arts area upgrades (stage lighting and sound)
- Continue upgrading building video surveillance cameras
- Upgrade wireless network systems to support future devices and network bandwidth needs
- Address device replacement cycles
- Explore future applications for blended learning and personalized learning environments

#### BOND FUND TRANSPARENCY COMMITTEE

I would like to thank the community for its support and passage of the .75 mill bond proposal this past November. This millage generated \$13,029,577 after fees and will allow the district to address needed building and site improvements. Please visit our website at **www.monashores.net/our-district/bond-fundtransparency/** for real-time updates of projects we will be undertaking with this funding.

In addition to creating the bond fund transparency webpage, we have also formed a Bond Transparency Committee. This committee is comprised of two community members, Vicki Broge and Tim Holman, in addition to board member Jay Keessen. All three members have extensive business and finance backgrounds and degrees. We established this committee to ensure safe, responsible bond fund investing and resource allocation. The role of this committee is to advise and oversee investment of bond proceeds. Additionally, this committee will ensure bond proceeds are spent on the most pressing needs identified in the Facility Assessment Study completed in April 2014. Once again, this committee is to oversee and advise; all final decisions are still the responsibility of the Board of Education.

The Bond Transparency Committee had its first meeting on Thursday, February 11, 2016. At that meeting, I proposed investing the bond proceeds which will be received on February 24, 2016, in U.S. Treasury notes with tiered maturation dates that will correspond with projected cash needs as projects are completed. We will be utilizing PFM Asset Management LLC as investment advisor with the Michigan Liquid Asset Fund (MILAF) as the depository. MILAF is a board approved depository the district has utilized for several years and caters specifically to Michigan schools and ISDs. PFM Asset Management LLC is a SEC-registered investment advisor with over 34 years of experience serving public/non-profit clients with over \$59 billion in assets under management. This firm has retained the number one national ranking in municipal finance advisory services for seventeen consecutive years. The committee agreed that this is an appropriate strategy for fund investment. The committee will meet again in April to review requests for proposals on the High School and Lincoln Park roof replacement as well as elementary playground upgrades that will occur over the summer of 2016.

On a final note, I celebrated my one year anniversary with Mona Shores this past January and I am proud and grateful to be associated with such an outstanding school district and community. I am continually amazed by the talent and temperament exhibited by our students as well as the high expectations and dedication of our staff. Mona Shores truly is "Sailing Forward".

# **Office of** SPECIAL EDUCATION

A Message from Mary VanderMolen, Director of Special Education

In my office there is a sign that reads "Every Child is a story yet to be told." I see that sign every day and it reminds me that our mission in education is to focus on each child as an individual. This is an important reminder for all of us. But, lately when I read the sign my focus narrows in on the small word "yet."

We have long known that children reach their developmental milestones at different times along their journey to adulthood. It's been easy for me to see this because I am the parent of twins. The twins learned to walk at different times; one threw and caught a ball before the other; one read earlier; one learned to swim before the other, and on and on.

Likewise, attention to, and mastery of school and class expectations are achieved at different times by each child. At any given time in any given classroom in Mona Shores or any other school district, there sit 25-30 students all at different points in their development. Take a kindergarten classroom for example. There you will find students who already know how to read and others who can't yet identify all the letters in the alphabet. There you will find students who have an understanding that numbers represent values and others who can't yet count to ten. There you will find students who can participate in a group activity with their peers and others who can't yet keep their hands to themselves while in a line. There you will find students who can write their names neatly and those who can't yet color or use a scissors to cut. There you will find students who can express their feelings appropriately and those who struggle yet to find their words and can only express feelings through acting out behaviors. Similar scenarios will be found at all grade levels as each classroom has students at various points in their development around the typical milestones expected to be mastered at that age and grade.

So... what's a teacher to do? Fortunately in Mona Shores we approach these differences in learning with something called MTSS or a Multi-Tiered System of Supports. This PreK-12 system utilizes interventions for both behavior and academics designed to give the student what he needs to bring him closer to that content or grade level standard or behavior expectation. Each of our buildings have teams that look at the academic and behavior data for all students. Through these teams we are able to identify students who need a little or a lot of extra support and also focus on the specific area where that support should be targeted. It may be additional help in reading or math or it may be extra behavioral supports or reteaching of the class and school expectations through our PBIS (Positive Behavior Interventions, teachers can help students close those gaps and raise achievement for all students.

Mona Shores is committed to the MTSS process as demonstrated in our District Strategic Plan. Objective 2 of our Teaching and Learning goal states, 'MSPS will ensure a high quality learning environment through instructional best practices in academics and behavior utilizing a well-defined multi**tiered system of supports PreK-12.'** The development, implementation, and continued improvement of our MTSS process for academics

and behavior means great things for our students. It supports Mona Shores commitment to ALL students and fosters the Growth Mindset I spoke about in January's Lighthouse View article. Here is Carol Dweck's (author and researcher from Stanford University) definition of fixed vs. growth mindset.

"In a fixed mindset students believe their basic abilities, their intelligence, their talents, are just fixed traits. They have a certain amount and that's that, and then their goal becomes to look smart all the time and never look dumb. In a growth mindset students understand that their talents and abilities can be developed through effort, good teaching and persistence. They don't necessarily think everyone's the same or anyone can be Einstein, but they believe everyone can get smarter if they work at it."

This brings us back to that small but important word, 'yet.' With a growth mindset our teachers will no longer think, "he can't read well" and instead think "he can't read well yet." A student will not think, "I don't know how to add fractions " and instead think "I don't know how to add fractions yet." Now our students and teachers have a system in place through MTSS that helps support students who are not there "yet." Every day students' talents and abilities are being developed, like Dweck said they would, through effort, good teaching, and persistence. Are we where we need to be? Not YET, but we will continue to move in that direction with a Growth Mindset and our MTSS system for ALL students.

Roughly 1,500 of our state's most well-rounded senior athletes apply for the award each year. In short, it is the highest honor a high school student-athlete can receive in our state.

#### **SCHEDULING 2016-2017**

Scheduling for the 2016-2017 school year has wrapped up here at the high school. The counselors met with each student regarding their scheduling choices for next school year and future plans. Students also updated their EDP's and explored Career Cruising. If your son/daughter did not turn in their scheduling forms, please have them bring to the counseling office as soon as possible.

#### **MUSKEGON AREA PROMISE**

Beginning in May 2017, all graduates of Muskegon County Schools are eligible for TUITION-FREE PROMISE Scholarships. The PROMISE covers tuition, books, and mandatory fees at the current \$4,290 MCC rate. Students must:

- Live in the MAISD boundaries
- Graduate with a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or higher
- Apply for FAFSA
- Enroll at Muskegon Community College or Baker College.

NO Application is needed for this award. Students will be sent a letter of eligibility.

#### SCHOLARSHIP FORMS

Any senior who has received a scholarship should fill out the "Award Form" in order to be recognized at the Honors Convocation. These forms will be available in early May. Please list all scholarship earnings and awards that you have been granted to date, whether you have accepted them or not as well as whether you are attending the college or not. Do not include loans or Pell Grants. It is important that you write legibly and include the full name of the scholarship/award including the college name if applicable.

#### **FINAL TRANSCRIPTS**

Seniors will be meeting with their counselors individually for an Exit Interview. During this time seniors must notify their counselor which college must receive a final transcript.

#### SCHOLARSHIPS

There are scholarships listed on our Counseling Department website with applications available in our office or online. Please remember that you should allow 5-7 days prior to the deadline for processing. There are monthly listings posted on our high school webpage. • Seniors planning to attend Muskegon Community College: Students should complete the General Scholarship Application in the Scholarship Guide that MCC provides. We have copies in our office. Students complete one application for the various scholarships available at MCC.



#### COLLEGE AWARENESS WEEK/ COLLEGE DECISION DAY

Mona Shores High School participates in the statewide initiatives with the

goal to have every graduating high school senior complete at least one college application. On College Decision Day (May 1) we ask each senior to notify our Counseling Office of their post high school plans. College Decision Day coincides with the date



that most seniors are to inform a college of their plan to enroll. Please confirm with your student that they've submitted their name, college attending, military service or post-secondary plans.

#### **FINANCIAL AID**

The financial aid process begins with submitting the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online after January 1st of the year you plan to enroll. The FAFSA evaluates eligibility for need-based aid, including federal loans, and gives students access to need-based grants, scholarships, loans, and work-study. For assistance in completing your FAFSA, please contact either Baker College or attend one of MCC's FAFSA Friday sessions. These services are available to the community (student need not be planning to attend either

college for assistance). For more information, please contact the Financial Aid office at MCC: Phone: (231) 773-9131.

#### SUMMER SCHOOL

Information regarding summer school at Mona Shores High School will be available in the Counseling Office and on our website after Spring Break. This is an outstanding opportunity for students to either do credit recovery for one or two classes or do credit enhancement to get ahead in their coursework. Each class spans a three-week time period, and it is imperative that students attend every session. Check out the website for the fees, specific dates, and the courses being offered, or contact your student's counselor.

#### CREDIT RECOVERY CLASSES

Students who have failed classes or are behind in credits may elect to take an online course after school through the High School's credit recovery program. The student needs to see his/her counselor to complete an application and determine which

course needs to be taken. Each half-credit course costs \$100 to cover the cost of the class and the instructor who is available Monday through Thursday from 3:00 - 4:30 p.m. All work needs to be completed at school and should be finished within a trimester's time.

#### **TESTING OUT OF CLASSES**

Testing out of classes provides students with an opportunity to earn a credit in a course by passing an examination during the summer. The student must complete a request form (available in the Athletic/Counseling Office) and then turn it in to Ms. Marine along with a refundable \$25 check. The student will be given a packet of study materials, including a book, prior to the end of the school year. Students must earn an 80% or better on the exam in order to receive credit for the course. The examinations are generally scheduled for the latter part of July.

# Lincoln Park New Year and New Initiatives with the New Principal

Since the start of the new school year, Lincoln Park has been intentionally focused on recognizing positive behavior, establishing new procedures, starting new traditions, and implementing new school structures to help us meet all student's needs. Lincoln Park students, parents, and staff have done a fabulous job transitioning to new procedures, new expectations, and new systems.

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# Here are a few of the new initiatives at Lincoln Park this year.



• Positive Recognition: New additions to the already wellestablished positive behavior program include brightly colored embroidered tags called "spirit sticks" which students can earn in a variety of ways for behavior and academic growth and the new monthly "Birthday Table" where students receive ice cream and a birthday spirit stick to celebrate their special day.

• Building Procedures: The hallways now have hanging signs making it easier to find classrooms and there are signs directing all visitors to the office to sign in and wear a visitor's tag to ensure student safety. On

rainy or super cold days, parents and bus drivers can look for the red flags posted on the outside of the building that let them know to send their children directly inside. Staff and students can now look down the hallway for the bright orange construction cones that signal indoor recess.

- Academics: One of the biggest changes for Lincoln Park is the addition of WIN time. WIN stands for "What I Need" and is a 40 minute designated time built into each grade level's schedule to provide intervention, remediation, or acceleration to students. Our current data shows a 13% increase in students scoring above average in reading and a 7% decrease in students scoring below average since implementing WIN. With this new structure, we are able to provide 145 students with additional instruction each day that does not interrupt their regular instruction.
- **Programs:** New programs added to Lincoln Park this year include the CREW Choir, Jump Rope for Heart, and the Feelin' Good Mileage Club. The CREW Choir is led by music teacher, Cathy Sander, and meets after school each week on Wednesdays. They will be performing at the Lumberjacks game on March 17th. Jump Rope for Heart was organized by gym teacher, Marc Lans, and raised \$3527 for the American Heart Association. Lincoln Park plans to make this an annual fundraiser event. The Feelin' Good Mileage Club will also arrive at Lincoln Park this spring! With the support of the PTO and parent volunteers, students will be running and walking a course during recess and recording their miles.

As you can see, our staff and students are having an incredible year! Thank you to our students and their families for the continued behavior and academic support at home.

It is critical for everyone to learn about the importance of the honeybee! One out of every three bites of food we take relies on bees for pollination. Of 100 major crops, 70 are pollinated by bees—including apples, cucumbers, broccoli, onions, pumpkins, avocados, almonds, and so many more. America's bees are in crisis. These critical pollinators are dying at some of the highest rates ever recorded—a whopping 42% of U.S. bee colonies collapsed in 2015! We need to understand and embrace them, and care about their well-being. Our beehive will stimulate curiosity in our students and staff, and encourage everyone to learn about the importance of the honeybees in our lives.



- **Plastic Recycling** While Ross Park has been recycling paper and cardboard weekly for years, fourth graders will now participate in collecting the plastic recycling in the building each week as well. *Goal Category: Reduce/Reuse/Recycle*
