


Dear Community of Mona Shores Public Schools

Assessment in Mona Shores

In April, Michigan will begin giving the annual State assessments in 3rd grade through 11th grade. 3rd grade through 8th grade will give the M-STEP, which is the Michigan Student Test of Educational Progress. 9th and 10th grade students will take the PSAT and 11th grade students will take the SAT/ACT WorkKeys/M-STEP.

The M-STEP will assess students in grades 3-8 in English language arts (reading, writing, and listening) and mathematics. Science will be assessed in grades 4 and 7 and Social Studies in grades 5 and 8.


Grades 9 and 10 will be assessed using the PSAT, which assesses reading, writing, math, and critical thinking.

Grade 11 will be assessed in 2 core areas (Science and Social Studies) in addition to the SAT which is taken on April 11, 2017.

Mona Shores will be fully prepared for the M-STEP, SAT, and all other State Assessments from a student, staff, and technology perspective. It will be exciting to see the performance of our Sailors across the District as they take on these State assessments.

Bonded Construction UPDATE

At the board work session that occurred on Monday, February 6, 2017, the board approved the construction bids for work to occur this summer for the final phase of our 2016 Bond. Total approved bid amount was \$4,280,874. This amount is for construction only and does not include architect fees, construction management fees or construction contingencies. The board approved renovations per building are as follows:

Campbell Elementary

- Playground renovation including new playground equipment, fall protection, landscaping, drainage, concrete and fencing - \$500,986
- Internal security vestibule \$208,689
- Select exterior doors and frames \$16,438
- Replacement of boilers and circulating pumps \$162,453

Churchill Elementary

- Interior security vestibule \$148,677
- Select exterior doors and frames \$9,588
- Membrane roof replacement \$251,515
- Replacement of boilers and circulating pumps \$162,321

Lincoln Park Elementary

- Exterior security vestibule and office reconfiguration \$184,754
- All exterior windows replaced \$500,465
- Select exterior doors and frames \$47,625
- Playground renovation including new playground equipment, fall protection, landscaping, drainage and concrete - \$428,499
- Replacement of boilers and circulating pumps \$140,216

Ross Park Elementary

- Main office interior security vestibule and child care external security vestibule and office relocation \$447,818
- Select exterior doors and frames \$25,482
- Wall tile replacement in main corridors \$96,003
- Exterior soffit and fascia replacement- \$218,080
- Replacement of circulating pumps \$47,359

Middle School

- Interior security vestibule \$245,253
- Select exterior doors and frames \$47,499
- Wall tile replacement in main corridors \$113,994
- Exterior soffit and fascia replacement \$172,750

High School

• Window and door replacement in courtyard corridors - \$104,410

With the exception of the High School corridor replacement, which will occur over spring break 2017, all work is scheduled to commence June 16, 2017. Additionally, during spring break we will install a sample test pattern for tile replacement. This sample will be located in the Middle School across from the eighth grade wing. Campbell Elementary and Lincoln Park Elementary will also receive new carpet this summer once construction at those buildings is complete. All locations will also receive updated wireless access points.

A Message from Jennifer Briggs Russell, Director of Special Education & Student Services

What is IDEA?

IDEA stands for "Individuals with Disabilities Education Act." IDEA is a law that ensures services to children with disabilities. IDEA governs how states and local public schools and agencies provide early intervention, special education, and related services to more than 6.5 million eligible infants, toddlers, children and youth with disabilities in our nation (U.S.D.O.E., 2017).

The first version of IDEA was passed by Congress in 1975. At that time, it was known as the Education for All Handicapped Children Act (EHA). IDEA has been amended and reauthorized by Congress several times over the last 42 years. Prior to 1975, over one million children with disabilities in the United States were excluded from educational opportunities, and millions more were denied adequate access to public education.

The original four purposes of the 1975 legislation remain critically relevant here and now, in 2017. The U.S. Department of Education (2007) lists the four

- "to assure that all children with disabilities have available to them...a free appropriate public education which emphasizes special education and related services designed to meet their unique needs"
- "to assure that the rights of children with disabilities and their parents...are protected"
- "to assist States and localities to provide for the education of all children with disabilities"
- "to assess and assure the effectiveness of efforts to educate all children with disabilities"

One of the principles of IDEA, is to ensure students with disabilities receive "Free and Appropriate Public Education (FAPE)."

FAPE includes the special education and related services provided to children with disabilities at public expense, under public supervision and direction, without charge to parents. The programs and/or services written into an Individualized Education Program (IEP) must meet both Federal, and State of Michigan, Department of Education standards and be provided according to the IEP. The services and programs provided must be designed to meet the individual needs of the student and to prepare them for future education, employment and independent living.





SCHEDULING 2017-2018

Scheduling for the 2017-2018 school year has wrapped up here at the high school. The counselors met with each student regarding their scheduling choices for next school year and future plans. Students also updated their EDP's and explored Career Cruising. If your son/daughter did not turn in their scheduling forms, please have them bring them to the counseling office as soon as possible.

MUSKEGON AREA PROMISE

Beginning in May 2017, all graduates of Muskegon County Schools are eligible for TUITION-FREE PROMISE Scholarships. The PROMISE covers tuition, books, and mandatory fees at the current \$4,290 MCC rate. Students must:

- Live in the MAISD boundaries
- Graduate with a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or higher
- Apply for FAFSA
- Enroll at Muskegon Community College or Baker College.

NO Application is needed for this award. Students will be sent a letter of eligibility.

SCHOLARSHIP FORMS

Any senior who has received a scholarship should fill out the "Award Form" in order to be recognized at the Honors Convocation. These forms will be available in early May. Please list all scholarship earnings and awards that you have been granted to date, whether you have accepted them or not as well as whether you are attending the college or not. Do not include loans or Pell Grants. It is important that you write legibly and include the full name of the scholarship/award including the college name if applicable.

FINAL TRANSCRIPTS

Seniors will be meeting with their counselors individually for an Exit Interview. During this time, seniors must notify their counselor which college must receive a final transcript.

SCHOLARSHIPS

There are scholarships listed on our Counseling Department website with applications available in our office or online. Please remember that you should allow 5-7 days prior to the deadline for processing. There are monthly listings posted on our high school web page. 
• Seniors planning to attend Muskegon Community College: Students planning to attend MCC should complete the General Scholarship

SAT

Mona Shores High School's code is 232704. The basic fee for the SAT (no writing) is \$45 and SAT plus writing is \$57.



COLLEGE AWARENESS WEEK/COLLEGE DECISION DAY

Mona Shores High School participates in the statewide initiatives with the goal to have every graduating high school senior complete at least one college application. On College Decision Day (May 1), we ask each senior to notify our Counseling Office of their post high school plans. College Decision Day coincides with the date that most seniors are to inform a college of their plan to enroll. Please confirm with your student that they have submitted their name, college attending, military service or post-secondary plans.

FINANCIAL AID

The financial aid process begins with submitting the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online after October 1. The FAFSA evaluates eligibility for need-based aid, including federal loans, and gives students access to need-based grants, scholarships, loans, and work-study. For assistance in completing your FAFSA, please contact either Baker College or attend one of MCC's FAFSA Friday sessions. These services are available to the community (student need not be planning to attend either college for assistance). SUMMER SCHOOL

Information regarding summer school at Mona Shores High School will be available in the Counseling Office and on our website after spring break. This is an outstanding opportunity for students to either do credit recovery for one or two classes or do credit enhancement to get ahead in their coursework. Each class spans a three-week time period, and it is imperative that students attend every session. Check out the website for the fees, specific dates, and the courses being offered, or contact your student's counselor.

CREDIT RECOVERY CLASSES

Students who have failed classes or are behind in credits may elect to take an online course after school through the High School's credit recovery

program. The student needs to see his/her counselor to complete an application and determine which course needs to be taken.


Each half-credit course costs \$100 to cover the cost of the class and the instructor who is available Monday through Thursday from 3:00 – 4:30 p.m. All work needs to be completed at school and should be finished within a trimester's time.

TESTING OUT OF CLASSES

Testing out of classes provides students with an opportunity to earn a credit in a course by passing an examination during the summer. The student must complete a request form (available in the Athletic/Counseling Office later this month) and then return it along with a refundable \$25 check. The student will be given a packet of study materials, including a book, prior to the end of the school year. Students must earn an 80% or better on the exam in order to receive credit for the course. The examinations are generally scheduled for the latter part of July.

ATHLETICS – MSMS Athletics: A Leap in Quality and Quantity – Jake Manning

The last year has seen a mighty leap for Mona Shores Middle School Athletics. Stemming from the visionary leadership of MSHS Athletic Director, Ryan Portenga and a dedicated group of MSPS teacher-coaches, the District approved the rekindling of B-team basketball as well as financially bolstering other athletic teams. This move alone has doubled, on some teams, the numbers of MSMS Sailor athletes who were in competition this school year. More broadly, these changes began the process of aligning all athletic endeavors 6-12 program-wide, with the addition of 6th grade students included in individual sports.

This leap in quantity is only possible because of some quality educators coaching our Sailors. Teacher-coach, Alex Parr has completely revamped our MSMS tennis program with 35 student athletes participating last spring. Similarly, Kyle Mireles and Joe Latz are both MSPS teachers and have grown a county-champion MSMS cross country program to field over 90 runners this year! Justin McFarland, a youth pastor in our community, over doubled the number of wrestlers in his second season -- he finished the season with 45 student athletes! Finally, teacher-coach, Laura Gotaas has a conference-champion MS co-op swim and dive team that competed with over 50 swimmers!

Similarly, through hours of sweat, planning, and with the backing of the Sailor Classic Committee, three MSMS teacher-coaches, Joe Latz, Scott Volkmann, and Taylor Hawes have breathed new life into the MSMS Fitness Center. This newly remodeled room is a multi-functional, 21st century space for students, athletes, and staff.

All in all, Mona Shores Middle School Athletics grew in quantity and quality due to a core group of teachers and community members who have taken on the life-changing role of coaching our Sailors. These men and women teach and demonstrate our character traits of PRIDE throughout every workout, practice, and competition. Our MSMS coaches are investing in our athletes in ways that will continue to pay-off in high school and college athletics, and, most importantly, in living their best life today and into tomorrow.

There are some standout performances worth mentioning. Jake Trygstad, our Buddy the elf, seemed born to play the role, approaching it with overwhelming energy and enthusiasm. Jacob Gravlin brought experience and nuance to the role of Walter, Buddy's dad. Megan Quigg conveyed maturity as Buddy's step mom, and Chloe Nelund was endearing as his half-brother, Michael. Jessie Lawton had the perfect mix of sarcasm, vocal prowess, and intensity as Jovie, Buddy's love interest, and Matt Hylland was kind and jolly as our Santa Claus. We had an incredible ensemble full of featured performers and soloists, which gave our production the life and energy it needed. I am proud of each and every one of the students involved.

I am also humbly indebted to our parent volunteers, especially the committee heads, for their work on the show. As anyone in the performing arts community can tell you, it truly takes a village to put on quality work, and I am lucky that our village is full of some of the most generous parents a director could ask for, many of whom have volunteered with us for multiple years. ACADEMICS -- Fostering a Love of Reading - Dawn Medendorp

Since September, the middle school Language Arts Department has added over \$5000 to our classroom libraries through donations, grant funding, DonorsChoose.org, and personal purchases. Through having high-interest, diverse, current literature at our students' fingertips, they are reading more, and are more engaged with what they are reading. In Reading Essentials, Reggie Routman explains that "Classroom libraries are a literacy necessity; they are integral to successful teaching and learning and must become top priority if our students are to become thriving, engaged readers." This is a sentiment that we have embraced this fall. Through focusing on increasing our classroom libraries and providing more opportunities to engage in chosen literature, we are seeing our young readers' abilities and interest skyrocket.

Research shows that motivation to engage in pleasure reading diminishes as students enter their teenage years. This is cause for concern because independent reading not only provides avenues to build character, but also propels students to have the knowledge and skills needed to be successful 21st century adults. As middle school Language Arts teachers, a major focus this school year has been to increase our developing readers' interest in choosing and reading novels independently. In the sixth grade, students are learning to notice how novels can depict experiences and feelings they may have encountered in their own lives through their Character Connection project. They are also learning to think critically about their reading through a Story Element Project. In the seventh grade, reading is being propelled through featuring high-interest novel options, showcasing specific authors, and sharing monthly Book Talks. Students in this grade create and share a "Writing in the Zones" project, which allows students to showcase their book through tweets, memes, personal connections, and more. In the eighth grade, we have been excitedly altering lessons and entire units to center our learning around the use of chosen literature. Students are expected to read nightly, and find new books through weekly featured books, our Book Talk Creation project, sharing personal reviews with their classmates, and using social media. The eighth graders had the pleasure of meeting three local authors this fall, which sparked their interest in the creative writing process, and showcased many new novels. Additionally, with the help of our Library Media Specialist, students were able to experience a "Book Speed Dating Day"; students flirted, wooed, and started relationships with many new novels! In all of these grades, students are pushed to read simply for the love of it, and the projects are in place to push thinking and celebrate all the fantastic reading that is occurring throughout the building.

Lincoln Park **CREW News**

Lincoln Park staff continues to intentionally focus on recognizing positive behavior, refining our instruction, and implementing school structures to help us meet all students' needs.





Here are a few ways we are working to do that at Lincoln Park this year.





Be Nice.: A new addition to our already well-established positive behavior program includes the "be nice." program. With the help of the Mona Shores High School Student Senate, students and staff learned about "be nice" and the need to Notice, Invite, Challenge, and Empower others. "be nice" is a countywide program that is focused on improving mental health for students and the community.

Academics: Lincoln Park is in the second year of implementation of WIN time. WIN stands for "What I Need" and is a 40 minute designated time built into each grade level's schedule to provide intervention, remediation, or acceleration to students. We monitor

student growth using iReady as our benchmark screener for both reading and math. Our current data shows a 20% increase in students scoring on or above grade level in reading and a 23% increase in students scoring on or above grade level in math. With this new structure, we are able to provide over 120 students with additional reading and math instruction that does not interrupt their regular core instruction.





As you can see, our staff and students are having an incredible year learning and growing together. Thank you to our students and their families for the continued behavior and academic support at home! Rocks 4th Annual Jump Rope for Heart Event


The 4th Annual Jump Rope for Heart event at Churchill was another huge success! We sailed past our goal of \$10,000 with a total of well over \$10,250!




LEGOS IN ACTION!

The 40 Book Challenge - 5th Grade

Donalyn Miller, in her book The Book Whisperer, challenges her students to read 40 books or more. This challenge has been accepted by classrooms throughout the United States, including the 5th grade classes at Campbell. The goal of the 40 Book Challenge is to get students to read a lot and to explore new reading genres. Forty books sound daunting, but if students average about 1 book a week, they can accomplish the goal. As an incentive to encourage students to read lengthy books, books that are over two hundred pages count as two books, over three hundred as

three, etc. If a student falls shy of the 40 book goal at the end of the year, and reads 25 or 30, their number will be celebrated and considered an accomplishment.

Eight students have already met the goal of 40 books, and are aiming higher. About half the students are on track to meet the challenge, with a book a week. Many more are close. Students have commented that the challenge pushed them to read genres they had not read before (such as science fiction) and were surprised to find they liked it. Almost all students reported that they felt they were reading more because of the challenge. Happy reading Campers and keep up the great work!
