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Emergency Response & AED Safety Program

The American Heart Association recommends using the "Chain of Survival Steps" to increase the chances of survival for victims of sudden cardiac arrest. Cardiac Arrest can happen at any time and at any age. Sudden Cardiac Arrest is a condition in which the heart suddenly and unexpectedly stops beating. Knowing how to do CPR and use an AED (Automated External Defibrillator) is the key to survival. An AED is a portable device that checks the heart rhythm and can send an electric shock to the heart to try and restore a normal heart rhythm.



CHAIN OF SURVIVAL STEPS:

- © Early recognition of a cardiac arrest and calling 911
- © Rapid bystander response with Hands Only CPR
- © Use of an AED
- © Advance life support
- © Post-Cardiac Arrest care

Earlier this fall we were selected by the Wes Leonard Heart Team to receive an AED. This AED is located by the Superintendent's Office for easy access to the Big Playground on Moulton Avenue, as well as the Upper Elementary Hallway. A fund raiser took place this fall to provide the Baseball Teams with a new AED for use during the spring and summer season and the Cross Country

Teams will use the same AED in the fall. I would like to thank everyone for their donations during this fall's fund raising efforts towards Our AED Safety Program, especially Andy & Lisa Olson and Margaret Pibuldhanapatana.



We now have 10 AED's in the building and at different sports fields! We are prepared for cardiac emergencies. We want to make sure students, their family members, and guests to our school and staff receive the best care when seconds count. That is why we are a MIHEART Safe School.

Learning CPR and how to use an AED is an ongoing project here at North Muskegon.

- © In October all the members of the senior class received Hands Only CPR and AED training.
- © Fourth, Fifth and Sixth Grade students have had a lesson in doing Hands Only CPR Chest Compressions.
- © Grades K 3 will receive an upcoming lesson in recognizing an emergency and knowing what to do. Along with how and when to dial 911, the importance of knowing their whole name, address and telephone number.
- © Staff members and coaches continue to be recertified in CPR and AED use and Hands Only CPR Training.


Lumberjack Reading Caravan Kicks Off




North Muskegon Elementary Celebrates Star Wars Reads Week!

Fifth Grade Flexible Seating at NM!



FLEXIBLE SEATING...

What happens when teachers and students think outside the box in classroom learning options? The answer is student centered, learner focused, and incorporates flexible seating! At the beginning of the 2017-2018, Mrs. Schultz and Ms. Bentley decided to take a research-based leap into implementing flexible seating in their classrooms. The results have been tremendous and far exceeded their expectations!

Research shows that "Children have a developmental need for movement, and flexible school furniture allows students to shift position, rock, rotate and roll." (California Dept. of Education, 2016) Mrs. Schultz and Ms. Bentley decided that in order to achieve maximum student engagement in their learning, a change

needed to be made. In September, they removed half of the student desks in each classroom and replaced them with tables, pillows, alternative seats, and rugs to highlight all learners and their individual needs. The outcome has been AMAZING!

At any given time, you will see students in each classroom actively engaged, on task, and working collaboratively. As with any new system, there are certain expectations that ensure success. Students follow expectations, manage the maintenance, and clean up at the end of each day.

They have taken ownership of their classroom environment and it really has become a source of pride for students.

"Flexible seating makes it easier to learn because you don't have to think about where you are sitting, or if

people are bothering you, you can move. You can choose the best spot for you. Another reason flexible seating is helping me this year in learning is because it helps me learn when you are in charge of your own space," said Alaina Cordle, a current fifth grader.

Oliver Chumley-Jarvis, another current fifth grader commented, "When you are in a desk, you're chained to the one place the entire day. In flexible seating, you can

sit in a desk if you want to or you can sit somewhere else if you want. ItThree of our fifth grade students presented their thoughts and experiences to the NM Board of Education. Paige Erndteman, Avery Moat, and Hunter Soelberg spoke to board members in Ms. Bentley's classroom while board members, staff, and parents enjoyed the flexible, comfortable seating this arrangement affords.

"Today's students require environments that encourage discovery and deeper learning, and flexible design is


> fundamental to the next generation of teaching and learning." (California Dept. of Education, 2016). At this time, Mrs. Schultz and Ms. Bentley have completely removed all of the traditional desks and have

replaced them with tables at a variety of different heights so that there are places that appeal to a variety of learning needs. Not only do students feel successful, but administration is seeing the benefits with reduced discipline referrals. In fact, the fifth grade

boasts zero referrals so far this year. Together, the fifth grade team is looking forward to using this as another tool to help with student success. feels more free."

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The Sixth Grade GVSU Boat Trip

In the beginning of October, Mr. Jarvis's 6th grade classes went on a W.G Jackson Boat trip! Each class took a separate trip, but all of them were good.

When we first got on the boat, everyone was jittery, for they were all excited. The GVSU experts split us into groups. One of the groups collected samples, while the other tested them. We collected samples at the surface and right at the bottom of the lake, 75 feet below the surface. Then we switched roles and took samples of a different part of Muskegon Lake. We realized that what we do on the land affects the quality of the water. This changed the way we looked at what we did on the boat. We found out the water quality of Muskegon Lake... is medium quality. It was on this field trip day and still is, we presume, mesotrophic. Mesotrophic is: a body of water having a moderate amount of dissolved nutrients. We discussed how what we do on the shores of Muskegon lake affects the quality of the water. We decided that in order to keep the water quality clean, we can choose to not litter or pollute. After we did all our samples, and figured out that Muskegon Lake is Mesotrophic, we put a sample of Muskegon Lake water under a microscope, and studied it. It showed that there were countless organisms in just a little petri dish! Did you know there is that much life, invisible to us? Then, sadly, it was time to go back to school.

That was a very educational field trip. I know myself, and many others learned a lot! And most of all, had a boatload of fun!









In Memory of Denise P. Meier

WHAT IS A SENSORY ROOM?

The Denise Meier Sensory Room has been an incredible resource for our students. The space and equipment available has allowed us to better meet a variety of sensory, fine and gross motor needs.









In addition to working with students during occupational therapy sessions, trained staff members are able to bring students to the room daily for scheduled breaks. The breaks are designed to help students meet their individual sensory and motor needs in order to return to the classroom regulated and ready to learn.
