



JANUARY 7 - MARCH 2 | Winter Reading Program


Cold winter days are perfect for getting lost in new stories! Sign

The collection can be browsed through our Cooperative website at *lakeland.overdrive.com* and is accessible anytime and from anywhere. The ebook and audiobook service operates much like checking out the print or physical version, but items are returned automatically on the due date and there never any overdue fees.

Do you have a new smartphone or tablet? Are you learning how to

use one? Please stop by the Library; we will happy to guide you step by step toward accessing audiobooks and eBooks from your device and learn a few other tips and tricks in the process.

If you are familiar with downloading and using apps, look for **Libby** in Google Play, the App Store or the Windows Store. Setup is quick and easy. Select "Add a Library," type in Hackly Public Library, and add your library card number.
