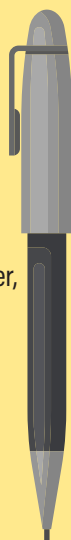

The Library will be no longer charging late fines for children and teens materials starting September 3rd. This change not only means no new fines going forward but forgiveness for past fines also!

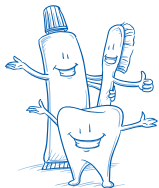
