





LOCAL HISTORY FEATURE

Have you been to Hackley Library's Local History and Genealogy Department?

Have you been to Hackley Library's Local History and Genealogy Department? It's located in the historic Torrent House building, which is across from HPL's Main Building.



Back in the Day... Much like how Charles Hackley's home had a Porte Cochere, so did John Torrent's House!

A porte cochere is a roofed structure extending from a building over an adjacent driveway, which served as an excellent way to prevent one from the elements while exiting their mode of transportation. This department houses a large collection of local history and genealogical materials, and provides access to numerous online databases.

Interested in viewing newspaper archives? There is quite a selection of various newspapers on Microfilm at the Torrent House, including the Muskegon Chronicle, dating as far back as 1880!


One of Hackley Library's latest projects is the Muskegon County Community Zine Collection! What's a zine? It's typically a self-published story, which can consist of text, images, artwork, comics, a combination of all - almost anything! They're often the size of booklets or pamphlets, and can often be reproduced, by photocopying the original.

This special collection will aim to be an amplifier for marginalized voices in our communities, and will consist of zine submissions from Muskegon County residents 18 years and older.


