## Library Cards Can Save You Money!

Have you ever wondered how much money you save by using your library card? Borrowing items from the library gives you the chance to enjoy new books, movies, tv shows, music CDs, magazines, and more, without ever having to spend a dime!

After testing out a Library Value Calculator from ilovelibraries.org, we discovered that if a family were to check out 3 adult books, 2 young adult books, 5 children's books, and 3 movies, you'd save approximately \$260.00!

Using your library card to borrow items not only gives you the opportunity to check out materials from your home library, but also through interlibrary loan (for example, borrowing items within the Lakeland Library Cooperative), through MeL (Michigan eLibrary), and through digital library eResources!

Just imagine, one trip to the library can save you hundreds of dollars, all from using your library card.

You can get a library card ANYTIME during the year! If you don't already have a library card, we encourage you to visit the library to get one. Getting a library card is free! As an adult who is 18 years or older, all you'll need is a valid state I.D. or driver's license

Youth who are under 18 can also get a library card of their own! To get a full access card, a child/teen can have a parent/guardian cosign.

#### LOCAL HISTORY FEATURE

#### A Brief History of the Torrent House


The Torrent House, unlike Hackley Library's main building, has had several past lives! Construction began in 1891, when lumber baron John Torrent's wooden home was moved off the lot. The completed home suffered major damage in a fire in 1894, just before the family was to move in. The Torrents and their children occupied the house until the 1920s, and after some contentious legal questions regarding ownership, the Ralph J. Balbirnie Funeral Home acquired the building around 1930. It remained a funeral home until 1942, when it was converted into the Muskegon Osteopathic Hospital. It served this function until 1957 when the addition was completed and became the main hospital.

When the now-defunct General Hospital was constructed in 1967, the facility was closed and eventually came under ownership of the Red Cross. The mansion itself fell into disrepair and was slated to be razed, but was saved through the heroic efforts of dozens of volunteers when the City of Muskegon acquired the building in 1973 to prevent its demolition. Parts and furnishings from long-destroyed buildings in Muskegon were used to restore the building to a more usable condition. Finally, the Friends of Hackley Library purchased the building in 1991, when a Designer's Showhouse provided the means for further restoration. The 2nd and 3rd floors have been in use by the Library since that time. The Local History & Genealogy Department was moved out of HPL's main building during the Library's major renovation, and has occupied the 1st floor since 2012. We look forward to this historic building providing many more decades of service!


The Ralph J. Balbirnie Funeral Mansion offered its services for 'reasonable charges' in this advertisement from 1930.



During its life as a funeral home, the Torrent House was almost entirely covered with ivy.



Parts of the Torrent House were used for different businesses over the years - possibly while some family members still occupied the home. This advertisement for the "Eff-'N'-Zee Tea Room" appeared in the Muskegon Chronicle, July 10, 1922.

#### **FEATURED STORIES**

We recently got a chance to talk with **SIMON SCHEER** 

a comics creator and contributor to our brand new zine collection, and here's what he had to say!

## 1. How old were you when you made your first zine?

I started drawing in my homework and in my tests in elementary school—I was lucky my teachers were very lenient! I would draw short little stories and pictures, which turned into zines when I got into fifth grade. I started selling them in sixth grade as a fundraiser for my brother's diabetes.



2. Where did you learn how to make zines?

I began drawing little one panel cartoons—little drawings to make classmates laugh—when I was really young. I loved reading the Captain Underpants series as a kid, and the style of George and Harold's comics really drew me in. I began to collect my little cartoons into small books, and short stories followed.

#### 3. Why did you choose the zine format over others?

My format came from mimicking comic books. I started off small, splitting a piece of paper into eight, and drawing. I soon realized my hands couldn't keep writing that small, so I graduated to a half sheet of printer paper. With more space, I felt I could tell the story I wanted to tell, while still keeping my intricate linework.

Technical aspect aside, I love the freedom of zines. It's a very forgiving medium, and I don't feel like I have to be bound down by elements you see in other mediums!

#### 4. You have published your first graphic novel, which is amazing! Was it easy to make that leap from zines to graphic novels?

Yes and no! Over the years, I've slowly been telling larger stories, with more ambitious storylines and more issues, so in that aspect I certainly felt ready. However—it was certainly daunting once I had started! I had never done something so big before, and the sheer quantity of work my project would take was a lot to take in. I felt like nobody warned me about how much time it would take! With all this, a graphic novel

was something I had always wanted to draw. It's a completely different feeling from zines to be holding a book in your hands that you wrote, you know?



## We love our patrons at Hackley Library, and are so excited to share Erick's HPL story!

Erick first started coming to the library when the internet was becoming more readily available. A friend of his had mentioned Hackley Library offers free internet access, and invited him to come along. The rest is history, and Erick has been enjoying the library ever since!

Erick mentioned he hadn't read much since high school, and coming to Hackley Library reignited that joy for reading. When he first came into the library, he noticed a book on Lucille Ball. Being a fan of the show I Love Lucy, he was immediately drawn to that book and read it cover to cover.

Erick likes the quietness of the library, and has incorporated coming to the library into his weekly schedule. Out of the six days that HPL is open, Erick is likely to come in at least four of those days. Hackley Library is often the first stop of his day! He embraces many of the resources the library has to offer, including using a computer to check emails, as well as searching for new books to read.

We are so grateful for Erick, and are fortunate to have him as a Hackley patron!

#### **DIRECTOR'S CORNER**

After reading about it recently in the Muskegon Chronicle, you may wonder what's going on with the Torrent House. If you have not already, take a few moments to read the history of the Torrent House in the Local History & Genealogy section of our newsletter.

A new era may be approaching for the iconic structure on W. Webster and Third Street. The Downtown Muskegon Development Corporation acquired the adjoining building to remove and to restore the Torrent House to a stand-alone edifice.

The current goal is to demolish the so-named "Community Services Building in October 2022. The Hackley Public Library is preparing a plan for weatherproofing the Torrent House while a capital campaign is underway to raise funds to restore and enhance the building.

The aspiration of the Library in taking on this project is to further establish the Torrent House's status as one of Muskegon's crown jewels for many years to come. As well as improving the building's exterior aesthetics, we hope to increase accessibility for the public,

allowing the Library to expand services and enhance the safety of the interior. Look for updates in the coming months. Contact the Community Foundation if you are interested in helping cover the costs for the demolition. As always, your feedback is also greatly appreciated!
