


WINTER READING PROGRAM - ALL AGES


TEEN EXCURSION -BEHIND THE SCENES AT THE ART MUSEUM

TEEN CRAFT - PAPER FORTUNE COOKIES



Newspaper Archives at Hackley Library

For decades before the age of social media, the local newspaper was the primary outlet for the public to engage with the stories of their community. The Muskegon Chronicle, which began as a weekly paper in 1869, is the most well-known of our local papers - outlasting the Muskegon Reporter, Times, Journal, and many other "competing" newspapers that existed alongside it. Even before the days of wireless communication, newspapers reported the events of the time whether wars in distant parts of the world or social activities right here in Muskegon. For many years, the Sunday edition of the Muskegon Chronicle often included over 30 pages of news!

Most newspapers reported events of local interest - marriages, births, deaths, and even birthday parties. This reporting offers a vital glimpse into the lives of those who came before, and provides a treasure trove of information for family & local history researchers. While we may know the facts of a story, newspaper reporting can provide insight into how the local community responded to these events.

Hackley Library's Local History & Genealogy Department holds the largest collection of local newspapers

on microfilm, as well as images of the Muskegon Chronicle after its 2019 switch to a digital archive. Since the advent of the digital age and the decline of print reporting, the "rights" to many newspaper archives have been purchased by large news corporations. Today, copyright laws and a costly conversion process prevent us from making most of our microfilm available as digital archives. However, all of our archives - both microfilm and digital are freely available for onsite research. Our microfilm scanners are easy to operate, and can capture digital images of entire pages of the newspaper at very high resolution. Because the archives have not been fully digitized. a specific date is often required to locate a particular article. We have many finding aids for locating the date of an event, and our helpful Local History & Genealogy team is always available to assist. Stop by Tuesday through Saturday, 10 AM - 5 PM, and check out our local history - reported as it happened, in the newspaper!

Stories that appeared in local newspapers highlighting the major events of the time are now valuable sources for historical research, like this 1913 article about the Lakewood area.

DIRECTOR'S CORNER

Hackley Public Library provides programs and services to unify the community, promote creativity, and encourage lifelong learning while preserving our storied past and preparing for an ever-changing future.
