





#### TRANSPORTATION UPDATE

The walk-out distance for all Mona Shores schools is 1.5 miles. Students eligible for busing are allowed one designated pick up location and drop off location only. Students must board and exit the bus at their designated/ assigned stop only.

Bus routes and bus stop locations are reviewed each year and may be changed for efficiency. Bus stop locations are established in accordance with state and federal laws and school board policies. The driver/aide are NOT allowed to make bus stop or route changes. Parents of students with specialized transportation needs will be contacted directly by the Transportation Department staff.

> **Parents may check Powerschool** Parent Portal for Bus Number and **Bus Stop information.**

#### PARENT RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Student/s must arrive at the assigned stop at least 5 minutes prior to the bus arrival time and be ready to board (NOT waiting in a vehicle or doorway of a
- Provide supervision for your student/s going to and from the bus stop and while at the bus stop.
- Accept responsibility for your student/s conduct while at the bus stop and on the bus.
- Dress your student/s appropriately for the weather while waiting at the bus stop.

#### **ELEMENTARY EARLY RELEASE MONDAYS:**

Buses will arrive 1.5 hours earlier than the normal scheduled drop off.

#### SECONDARY LATE START WEDNESDAYS:

Buses will arrive 2 hours later than the normal scheduled pick up.

#### **SCHOOL OF CHOICE (SOC) STUDENTS:**

Transportation is not included in the Schools of Choice plan and SOC students are not allowed to ride the buses during the first 2 weeks of school. However, at the end of the second week of school, after we ensure that we have adequate seating available for eligible resident students, you may contact the Transportation Department office at 231-332-8269 to see if there is room on a bus at an existing bus stop.

### End of The Year Brings a New Beginning

Sailor Athletics had yet another great year of accomplishments on and off of the field. Many of our athletes are recognized for what they do on the playing surface, but what they have been recognized for in the classroom leaves a much larger impact. Mona Shores High School had 9 of our teams go Academic All-State with 16 individuals that went Academic All-State as well. Volleyball, Boys Tennis, Girls Golf, Girls Swimming, Girls Bowling, Competitive Cheer, Girls Basketball, Hockey, and Boys Volleyball were the 9 teams that qualified for Academic All-State. This is quite the accomplishment and a testament to the work that our students are doing in the classroom with their teachers and coaches backing them while also finding time to compete.

With the academic success has also come triumph through many wins on the playing surface of each of our sport offerings. 8 of our Varsity sports were Conference Champions, 5 were Greater Muskegon Athletic Association Champions, 1 was a District Champion and 1 was a Regional Champion. For the first time in school history, our Boys Lacrosse team brought home the wooden mitten trophy as Regional Champions. Individuals had to lead these teams to their winning ways. Sailor Nation had 7 student-athletes achieve First Team All-State honors. Drew Hackney of Boys Tennis (3 time all-state, Regional Champ), Ke'Waun Farnum of Football, Dahmir Farnum of Football, Jesse Love of Football. Delaney Buckner of Girls Swimming (2 event Conference Champion), Trent Benedict of Hockey, and Jack Reelman of Hockey were the athletes that were recognized by either their coach associations or the media as being some of the best at their craft in the state. What an amazing representation of what being a Sailor student-athlete is all about!

With every ending comes a new beginning. Todd Conrad has served as the Athletic Director at Mona Shores High School for the past 5 years. He was the calm of the storm through COVID and the many challenges that brought to athletics. Todd was able to navigate Sailor Athletics during some of the harder times in our community. Thank You Todd for all you have done for Sailor Nation! The good news is that Todd will not be traveling far. Mr. Conrad will be assuming the Associate Principal role at Mona Shores High School beginning with the 2023-2024 school year. His absence is being filled by myself, Jack Nummerdor. I have been a part of the Sailor family for the past five years as the Middle School Assistant Principal and Athletic Director. My family and I are looking forward to the new opportunity to head Sailor Athletics. My wife Megan is an art teacher at Campbell and Lincoln Park Elementaries,

## CollegeBoard Advanced Placement Program

Sailors Raised the Bar in 2023! Congratulations to the students who participated in the advanced placement courses. There were 454 exams taken by 277 students. MSHS offered 27 AP Exams. There were a total of 234 students who earned a 3 or higher allowing for college credit to be earned. The percent of total AP students with scores of 3 or higher is 84.48 %. Well above the state and global average. This is a tremendous achievement. A direct reflection of the commitment of our students' tremendous work ethics and commitment to a rigorous curriculum that will best prepare students for post secondary education. In addition, the class of 2023 had 4 students earn the AP Capstone Diploma, signifying completion of 6 or more AP courses including AP Research and AP Seminar. Our teachers who lead these programs continue to participate as AP readers and attend specialized professional development. ### Celebrating the Class of 2023!

The Class of 2023 certainly has much to be proud of! The words Determined and Drive come to mind when we think of their ability to adapt and persevere.

The past 4 years have been incredibly challenging for this class. It was not an easy wave to ride. During their HS Career they experienced the state wide spring of 2020 shut down, a full year in hybrid, transition to full in person building wide and to end their career with a full school year, where many of the traditions were back in full swing.



A school record of over 10 million dollars in academic and athletic scholarships has been awarded and earned by the Class of 2023. In addition, there were 119 students who earned academic honor cords, 26 seniors earned a 3.5 or higher, 34 seniors earned a 3.75 or higher and 59

seniors earned a 4.0 or higher. It is important to note that this group of seniors performed well above the state and global averages on their SAT and AP exams .The National Honors Society senior members totaled over 3,777 community service and tutoring hours earning the National Community Service Sapphire Award. The list of fine art awards earned is extensive as well. Most notably the MSPS Fine Arts department earned national distinction for being named Best Communities for Music Education in 2023 for the 8th year in a row.

And MSHS being named a "Best High Schools in America" for the 5th year in a row.

None of this was possible without the hard work of each and every student, staff member, administrator, and Board of Education members. As well as, the importance of the many parents that are behind the scenes volunteering and supporting the many student activities that were provided this past school year. There is a lot to be proud of and much more to be accomplished!

#### **COLLEGE VISITS:**

Many colleges send representatives to our high school in the fall to talk to interested students. These visits usually begin in late September and continue through November. We will post notices of these visits on the daily announcements and Counseling Office bulletin board. **JUNIORS AND SENIORS** interested in talking to a particular college representative must sign up in the Counseling Office during the week of that school's visit. They must also obtain permission from the classroom teacher for that hour to attend.

Seniors may take up to 2 college visitation days to visit the colleges of their choice during the school year (to be charged as "XT" exempt from absences total - college visitation) pending prior counselor and administration approval. The form is available in the Attendance Office, and the student is responsible for getting the following signatures prior to the day off: parent, counselor, and administrator. The student must have a college representative sign the form at the college while visiting and then return it to the Attendance Office. If the form is not completed prior to the visit, the absence may be excused by the parent, BUT will not be exempt. The visitation days may not be used to visit MCC or Baker during school hours as they are local and students will have availability to attend during non school days.

#### **COLLEGE APPLICATIONS**

Most colleges, including Muskegon Community College, would prefer that students apply online at the college website beginning August 1. After students have completed their college application, place an order for your high school transcript in Parchment to be sent to the college where you applied (undergraduate admissions). The 'Order Records' link is found on the Mona Shores High School webpage. Please allow 5 school days for processing. All electronic requests for transcripts are free of charge through July 31 of the student's graduation year. Students must request OFFICIAL ACT/SAT scores directly from ACT or SAT. (There is a fee assessed for this service.) This can be done at <a href="https://collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/">www.actstudent.org</a> or <a href="https://collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/">https://collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/</a> if the student did not indicate at the time of registration for ACT/SAT to mail scores to prospective colleges.

#### **FINANCIAL AID**

Students will be able to file a 2023–24 FAFSA as early as October 1, 2023. The earlier submission date is a permanent change, enabling students to complete and submit the FAFSA as early as October 1 every year. #### **SELECTIVE SERVICE**

It is important that young men must register with the selective service when they turn 18. It is the law, and it may adversely affect eligibility for federal financial aid. Eligible candidates can now register online by going to this website: http://www.sss.gov. You need your social security number to complete this process.

#### **CLASS OF 2024 SENIOR FALL MEETINGS:**

Counselors will begin meeting with the Class of 2024 students in September. This is an early one on one meeting to work with seniors to help them prepare for post-secondary plans. Topics covered include:



#### INTRODUCING: SPECIAL EDUCATION SUPERVISOR - ROXIE AMMERAAL

As the largest district in Muskegon County, Mona Shores made the decision to hire a Special Education Supervisor to increase the availability, support and resources for our students, families and staff, Mrs. Ammeraal came to us from West Ottawa Schools, where she has been a special education teacher for 19 years. Mrs. Ammeraal is an active volunteer in West Michigan, and has supported Camp Sunshine (https://www.campsunshinemichigan.org/) since she first volunteered as a student at Hope College. By the time you receive this issue, Roxie will have already started working with our special education teams. We are looking forward to Roxie meeting our students, families and staff over the next few weeks.

#### INTEROCEPTION:

A huge thanks to our Therapy Crew for sharing information with us about sensory integration and sensory processing.

Most of us know the seven senses: Sight, Smell, Taste, Hearing, Touch, Vestibular (movement & balance), and Proprioception (body position). In this issue, our therapists share information about INTEROCEPTION, often called the "Eighth Sense." When

we don't understand or recognize the relationship between a feeling in our body, it can be upsetting, or cause anxiety. Something as simple as being "hangry" is a real experience that can influence how we respond to a situation. It is powerful to help students learn to identify and recognize the connection between a physical feeling and the resulting emotions.

## Sailing Tips from the Therapy Crew **Learn About Interoception**



### What is Interoception?

- Interoception is considered our '8th sense' and is necessary for self-regulation.
- This '8th sense' helps us to interpret and respond to how we are feeling on the inside.
- For example, our interoception system sends signals to our brain to help us know:
  - when we are hungry or thirsty
  - when we need to go to the bathroom
  - when our muscles are sore
  - when we are out of breath
  - when our skin is itchy

- There are many benefits to helping children develop this sense of interoception, including:
  - promotes the ability to recognize, describe, and respond to body signals
  - provides children with the tools to understand the connection between their physical state and emotional state
  - increases positive well-being
- In order to be skilled at noticing body signals from our sense of interoception, practice during everyday life is important.



### **Practicing Interoception at Home**

- Model using the body signals listed below to describe how your own body feels during daily activities.
  - i.e. "My bladder feels full after drinking so much juice." or "The air is so cold outside, my lungs feel tight."
- Model connecting your body signal to an action that promotes a sense of well being within the body.
  - i.e. "My bladder feels full so I need to go to the bathroom." or "My brain feels distracted so I am going to take a walk, and then come back to this task."
- During daily activities ask questions that prompt their attention to body signals.
  - i.e. while playing in the sand, "How does this sand make your hands feel?"




